





A common visual representation of neurodiversity (e.g., Doyle et al., 2020)

HOW DO YOU REALLY FEEL ABOUT BOCCONI?

"There's not enough space. During exam sessions the library opens at 8:30 and at 7:50 there is already a queue going outside."

HOW DO YOU REALLY FEEL ABOUT BOCCONI?

"I only go to the library in the night. Otherwise, I can't focus. there's too much noise, too many people walking around"

HOW DO YOU REALLY FEEL ABOUT BOCCONI?

"I actually study quite well in the library, the noise doesn't really bother me, and there's enough light. But there are not enough group studying spaces. Also, we need to work a lot in big groups and there are only a few separate spaces for it"

HOW DO YOU REALLY FEEL ABOUT BOCCONI?

There's just no space here

"The campus is quite small.[...]We only have two or three buildings for classrooms and usually they are very busy. It's almost impossible to find a place to study alone"


