INTRODUCTION

This booklet presents the outcomes of drawing workshops on the theme of nature conducted with primary school children as part of my graduation project, titled "Nurture in Nature". The drawings and their analyses featured in this book have fostered design choices made in the "Nurture in Nature" building design, which is further explored in the complementary graduation book. Additionally, the drawings represent independent outcomes of the graduation research.

Approximately eighty primary school children, around the age of 7, from two different schools in Rotterdam were posed the same question: "What is nature?". To ensure individuality in their responses and minimize the influence of classmates' ideas on their drawings, they were invited to contemplate the answer silently without expressing it aloud. The extensiveness of this question was deliberately a deliberate choice to encourage a diverse range of thoughts and interpretations from the students. The impact of this freedom on their drawing process, which is also compared to the surrounding environment of their schools' neighbourhoods, played a meaningful role in the research outcomes and its implications for the design project.

In addition to the workshops conducted in Rotterdam, the question "What is nature?" was also posed to children in Liège, specifically in the Bressoux/Droixhe neighborhoods, as part of the Nurture in Nature project. This activity was organized in collaboration with social workers from Amis de l'Étang. The drawings and artworks created during this activity have been included in this booklet.

It is important to note that the circumstances in which these drawings were created differed significantly from those in the school settings in Rotterdam. Therefore, a direct comparison of the raw outcomes may not provide conclusive insights. However, when examining the drawing process and the children's attitudes during the activities, a meaningful discourse can be established when comparing the processes to the school workshops.







C.B.S. BEATRIX GROOT-IJSSELMONDE, ROTTERDAM

Class 4a and 4b Age range: 7-9 years old

A relatively green (sub-)urban neighbourhood. When asked the question: 'What is nature?' it was met with enthousiasm and excitement. There was little to no hesitation from the students to start drawing their 'nature'. Many animals and creative forms of nature were the result, leading to an estimatino in medium to high nature connectivity. The small sample size of this research gives too little foundation to draw a correlation between the prominantly present green environment and the ability to perform the task. However, the process of the workshop was in line with theoratical research on psychological development in relation to nature connectivity (F. Lederbogen) (F. Mayer). When relating their researches to eachother it can be concluded that higher nature connectivity results in a stronger foundation for the development of concentration, impuls control and the ability to cope with stress.

Drawing observations:

- Trees with enormous treetrunks and small treetops
- Usually drawn in elevation/perspective
- Building or man-made space as anchor for a specific nature memory

MARIASCHOOL Spangen, Rotterdam

Class 4/5/6 Age range: 7-10 years old


A highly paved, urban housing area with a school demographic which is comparable to Groot-IJsselmonde (many students with a (multicultural) immigrant backrgound and fairly low income households). However, the amount of green/ nature in this neighbourhoood is radically different. Again, we cannot draw a singular conclusion or notice true correlations, but the school atmosphere differed by quite a lot from C.B.S. Beatrix. Converstaion with teachers and personal observations showed a lower focus and attention span, as well as multiple students who were inable to play outside during the breaks as a result of violence and agression. Many other circumstances other than nature connectivity, logically, have an impact on a child's psychological development but the inabality of more than 50% of the students to start individualy on the nature workshop hinted at a relatively low nature connectivity level. Enthousiasm levels and variety in creative answers to the question resulted in different outcomes to the Beatrix school. While some students did not know where to even star with the broad question, others knew what tehy wanted to draw but not how to draw these desired answers.

AMIS DE L'ÉTANG Droixhe, liège

Neighbourhood children Age range: 4-12 years old

The age group of the activity in Droixhe was much broader than in the schools in Rotterdam, which resulted in much variety in ability to understand, reflect on and answer the question. Sicne it was an activity and not a school lesson, we had the change to go outside and collect nature in the park ourselves. A few flowers were pretty, but the football was a lot more interesting. The drawings and arts and crafts that were created mostly turned into the direction of their bedroom. where nature would take on the role as the view or a houseplant. One girl, 8 years old, drew a very interesting picture of a house with nature/oustide on both sides. Interestingly enough, there was an extremely similar sunflower drawn by one of the kids in Liège and one of the students in Spangen, Rotterdam. Small petals in a circle and the inner part of the flower was drawn as a cross hatch. In terms of the process, it was in terms of enthousiasm inbetween the levels of C.B.S. Beatrix and the Mariaschool, but in terms of creativity and ideas ont he the meaning of nature it was more comparable to the Marischool in Spangen. Many children at the activity also mentioned not often visiting larger natural/green










