




Problemstatement



Elderly are missing social interaction within the living environment, which makes them inactive and **isolated** from the society.

How can architecture encourage and facilitate the **social interaction** between **young & old** in the living environment?

Goal



The elderly can grow old in a living environment that not only feels

familiar but also has a **lively** atmosphere. Elderly do not need to be clustered in residential areas and isolated from society because of their age, but can continue to live in a neighborhood with people of **different ages** as they have before.






Mixing Old & Young

- "Social contacts are enhanced in a community when residents have opportunities for contact, live in close proximity to others and have appropriate space for interaction" (Williams, 2005, p. 197).
- Preferences of resident, Site survey Tanthof (2020)
