It is a vital question nowadays how to preserve craft in the modern city and how to support visible shift from mass produced to personalized, handmade objects. Historically it is worth to look at Cracovian Workshop: artistic organiza-tion from Cracow that worked at the beginning of XX century and gathered artists, activists, craftsmen. It had huge impact on the craft culture in entire country and focused on education as well as artistic value of made objects. Today again I can be argued that there is significant need of high class training for craftsmen to enhance artistic value of craft objects. Especially in Cracow, link between craft and design schools should be strengthened.
