PROBLEM STATEMENT



THE CONDITIONS OF SPATIAL PLANNING AND ITS GOVERNANCE HAVE SUPPORTED SOCIAL EXCLUSION FOR MIGRANTS. URBAN SPACE BECOMES GROUND OF CONFLICTS, BECAUSE NATIVES AND MIGRANTS ARE FOUND IN FORCED SPATIAL PROXIMITY.


TRANSITIONING TO PERMANENT TYPOLOGY
