Narrator: Close your eyes, once more. We'll leave the boys to relax in peace at their favorite spot and head to the foyer hall.












Diagram of public and private areas inside block - (own illustration)















LEANING ON THE EDGES




READABLE FACADE



DESIGN FOR THAT MOMENT. MAKE THE FACADE READABLE, NOT JUST IN FORM, BUT IN CONTENT.















UNDER THE TABLE


THEY CRAWLED UNDER. A BOOK, SOME WHISPERS, LEGS CURLED IN LIKE A CAT.







A CHAIR. A WINDOW FRAME. FEET UP. BACK PRESSED INTO THE SILL.




STILL A FEW MINUTES TO GO. THE PARENTS SPREAD OUT ON THE NEARBY STEPS,

BAGS BESIDE THEM, EYES ON THE SCHOOL DOORS.




THE STAIRS BECOME A MEETING POINT, NOT PLANNED, BUT PERFECT.

GIVE STEPS A SECOND PURPOSE. NOT JUST FOR GOING UP OR DOWN.












MEETING AT THE BENCH


THERE'S ALWAYS THAT ONE BENCH. "MEET YOU AT THE USUAL?"


BENCHES AREN'T JUST BENCHES. THEY'RE COORDINATES IN A SOCIAL MAP.

MAKE THEM VISIBLE FROM A DISTANCE. GIVE THEM A VIEW. MAKE THEM WORTH MEETING AT.












CORNER RETREAT
