


Asplund's plan from 1928 of the area around Observatory Hill with the library with its slightly turned final position.








Fig.15. Transformations in favour of existing pedestrian traffic infrastructure, Image courtesy; Caruso St. John Architects







Elevation and Section of facades constructed in 1928










The design of the facade is reminiscent of Asplund's facade, with openings as repetitive elements and a sweep in as an abstraction of the existing frieze.

The rust is in dialogue with asplund's orange, with technique used by local assemblers for timber panel sizes.



The Antiquities Room allows for aspects of celebration of the Library and its Heritage to be transferred and celebrated in the new extension. This is the room that faces the city to the north of the Hill and serves as a museum of remembrance for Asplund's furniture, the City Library's archives, exhibitions and other overlapping use.

This relationship between the architectural concept, its physical development, the city and its new function is experienced here.
