


1. Sedimentation




2. Roughing filtration




3. Natural pond filtration




Initial situation



Possible expansion in 10-15 years time




Possible expansion in 5 years time




*"the steps grew upwards like rocks

their water wrinkles smoothed out"*





*I was wondering when I arrive

and leaving a trace*




*the steps
