- 1 200 x 100 mm steel C-profile
- 2 window frame profile, steel (outside)
- 3 retaining bolt
- 4 10 mm mortar
- 5 vapor barrier
- 6 150 mm wood fiber insulation
- 7 44 mm thermal break
- 8 steel bracket
- 9 200 mm reused concrete slab tripe insulation glazing
