
Campus – 'The campus, by contrast, focuses on the individual built object. The campus does not delineate spaces, but instead positions the objects within a seemingly limitless space'




The entrance of the building was renovated between 2016 - 2018 by diederendirrix, Van Eijk en Van der Lubbe.
