Location:	Friedrichshain, Berlin	
The posed problem,	While Berlin has an expansive art output, its results have been eschewed after the unification. The Informal art form of expressing freely in abandoned or open spaces, for all to see and learn is being lost. The informal creative forms, for example, a street artist or individual artist with a craft are being	

suffocated by the formal art forms such as galleries, and museums. The informal art scene is normally displayed on the façade of the city through street artists and graffiti, however, is not being supported spatially. Which results in not enough exposure for certain creative ambitions and lessens the income for many informal creative outputs.

According to one study, after surveying 1,745 artists based in Berlin, 24% of men and 19% of women can cover their daily living costs. Leaving over 80% of these artists having to rely on other forms of income to suffice, stating that their art is a "lost business". <sup>1</sup>

This issue is mainly due to the recent real estate development and economic landscape, where studio spaces are rising in price and availability. Thus decreasing the number of spaces where, informal creatives can teach, make or display their creative skills. The concern from this is that informal creative forms, will not be organically passed through different people of various ethnicities, financial brackets, ages, interests, and genders.

How can various Informal Creative Forms be translated into spaces in a Flexible Formal Space?

#### Sub questions

What different typologies are needed for creative, analytical, and literary/ practical art forms?

How can informal art take on a formal capacity? Is it as simple as informal= outdoor and formal= interior and to switch these criteria?

What is needed to prompt more attraction and income for the creative outputs that are now being pushed aside?

How can formal spaces become more flexible to support the creative center's needs and seasonal challenges?

What are the main driving force that ground all creative and learning activities together, is it an informal space, to be flexible, or rather a space designed for a certain use to give the users a direction?

Should the center have strict programs or space to just informally learn, which method of learning is beneficial and designed specifically for?

Potluck: Creative Centre

Joining multiple creative forms to make one space of learning, making, and expressing in an experimental Public Condenser.

The importance is to make a creative center that supports all forms of creative expression. A public condenser will add space for creative ambitions and give communal enjoyment (value), to the neighborhood. A condenser is a potluck for all informal creative forms, where persons who practice these forms can teach, learn, and display. Giving a platform for informal art to be in an experimental grey zone where it can be measured, yet uncontrolled between spatial barriers (formal-enclosed and informal-exposed). This is done by trying to include many different forms of creative abilities for different personas and users, in order to attract many different interests. These focal interests will be categorized into 3 separate pillars:

Creative- stereotypical creative elements such as painting, sculpting, metal work, etc.

Analytical- forms a base of 3 foundations, open learning, multimedia testing, and assemblage. Users who want to learn technical trades or analytical mediums for instance programming

Literary/Practical- Spaces to learn various skills, practical (cooking), social (public speaking, communication), and cognitive (business skills)

These 3 pillars will join through one common theme which is to learn through making and doing, which can be centered around certain programs. The centre will be rigid through set classes that teach certain trades by local artists, however, the spaces will obtain a certain fluidity and flexibility that can be transformed by the users. To match the ever-fast changing pace of the artist scene in Berlin, where it is to make, exhibit, and take down in certain spaces for seasonal and purposeful occasions. This Creative Centre is imagined to be an independent and useful tool for Berlin, which allows users to freely create, experiment, learn and market their skills and products. This gives the existing artist the space to both create and profit from their skills, while also teaching and nurturing Berlin's output of the new and aspiring artists.

#### **Process**

#### **Method description**

The research methods include observation, quantitative study, case studies, interviews with berlin residents, and research through literature, social media, pictures, and events. Focusing on research related to typologies/functions related to each informal creative form and how that is designed in a flexible formal setting.

The aim is to discover all forms of informal creatives, from creative form (e.g. painting), analytical form (e.g. Product design), literary and practical (e.g. business skills). From this then understand, what is needed for such creative spaces, and make a catalogue of typologies. Thus making a qualitative study of what spaces are vital for not only Berlin artists, but for residents learning purposes. This will be helpful in looking at case studies such as Container City, Documenta 15, and Dubai Design District Creative Community.

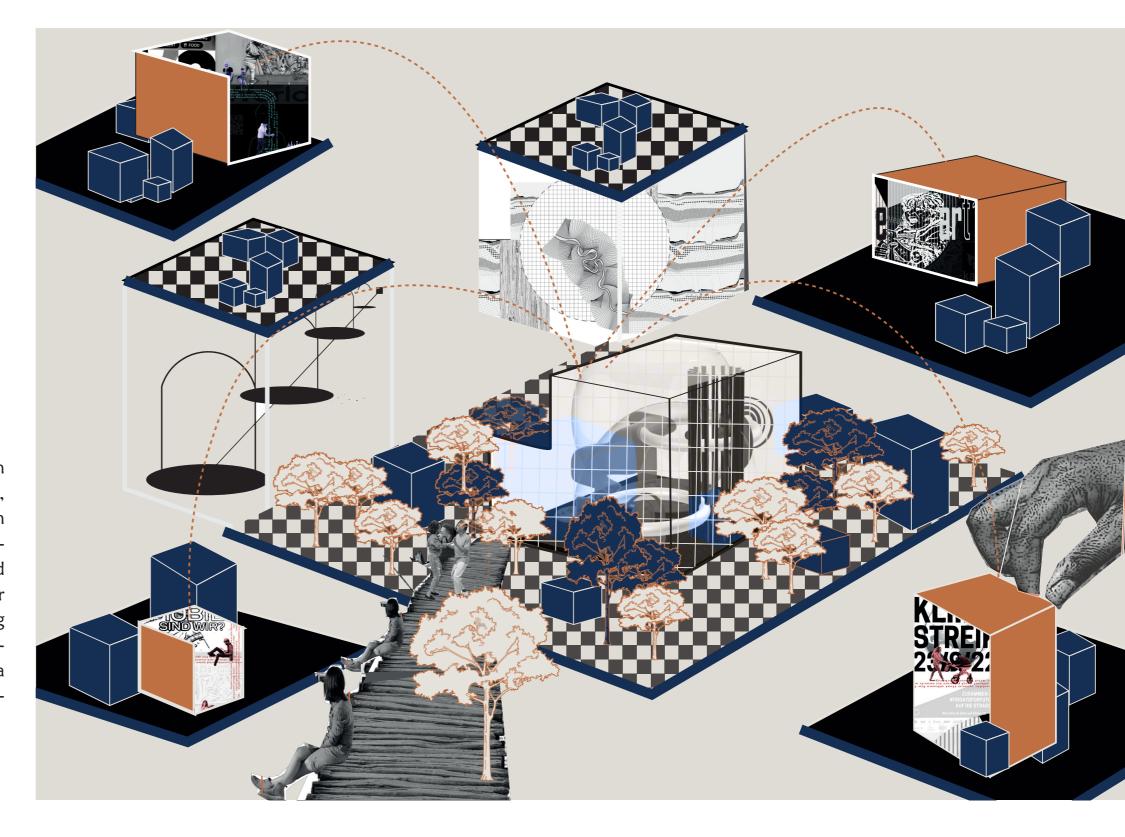

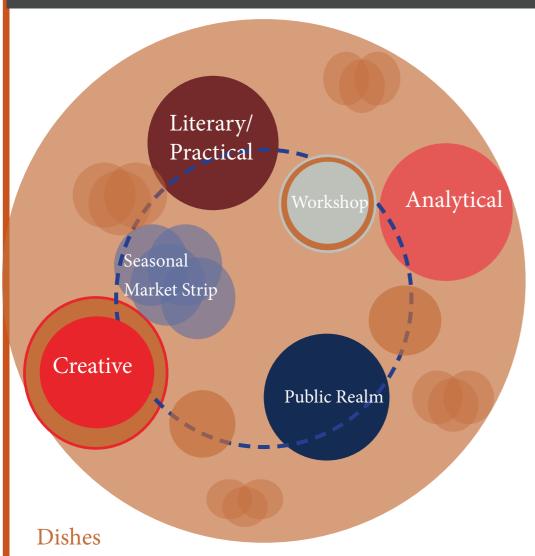
The scope of my project is to create a framework to base a creative module form. Creating a program that can combine and transform how different creative forms are viewed on a broader scale in the competence level of professions. Praising how creative forms are being embraced through learning may solve some of the social and ecological imbalances within a neighborhood, that is overlooked. Through embracing the commons this project aims to create prototypes of individual free-thinking spaces and programs while creating a unique multi-functional horizontally hybrid architecture form that can be used for inspiration. This architectural design is to showcase that massing forms should embrace special features based on location to create a successful site addition, while the program and interior design should embrace flexibility to allow for program transformation for future use (adaptability and sustainability).

### THEORY AND DELINEATION REMIX OUTCOME

The Outcome of the Theory and Delineation Stage has resulted in a remix of my Psycho-Map, Diagram stage, and 3D digital model. The main concept is to showcase that the individual creative pillars within the Potluck, are in a grand scheme of the archipelago theory. Each pillar is a seprate island that will have a networking system, to a central common space. This common space will encompass a master plan with a heavy park theme and will have outdoor activities that can include each pillar.

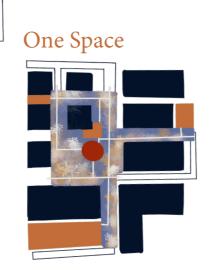

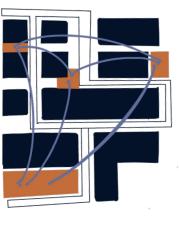

The building should be placed near public transportation, so it is ease of connection. The structure should become part of the overall design, the esthetic should both interact seemlessly with the existing buildings and functions, however fill the gap in function for the city. Brining a unique quality to the neighbourhood. This collage factors in that an architect has the ability to persuade people to use buildings for certain functions, and also allow for some experimental functions and flexibilty. Hence my POTLUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE takes on some of the qualities that is exhibited in the Collage:

- -a path guides people to the function though allow them to do different activities on such path
- -open perches and spaces allow for creative energy to flow for instance music a person playing music in a public scace.

### **POTLUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE**

When creating this montage it was a matter of simply creating a scene of what I believe My Public Condensor should encompass. This Collage infuses many seperate aspects that come together to form a diverse potluck of architectural elements. The main concept is that the public condensor is amongst nature and the distinction between indoor and outdoor functions are blurred. I also placed creative functions such as art, outdoor food functions, unique outdoor lounging spaces and a park for kids and adults to lounge and play in. These were all driving factors that were later infused into my POTLUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE.



When navigating the connection within the neighbourhood and the surrounding city, 4 main methods of public transport was mentioned: Metro, Train, Bus, and Tram. These methods of public transport make it quite easy to access the neighbourhood, while having 2 main differences: inner and border neighbourhood access.

- Inner Neighbourhood Transport:

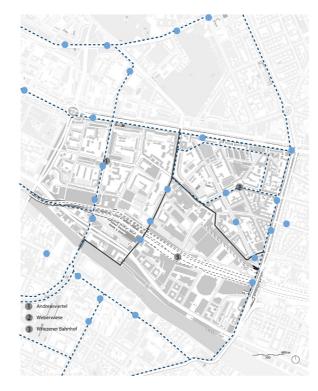
The train and bus systems brings people within the neighbourhood from the outer city. Having the bus running multiple stops within, while the train has one station for transit.

- Border Neighbourhood Transport:

The underground metro and Tram both run on the north and eastern border of the neighbourhood. Having multiple stops along the rim of the neighbourhood near entrance points for easy accessibility.

Regarding my POTCLUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE, since the public transport is a bit scarce within all neighbourhoods. The site chosen needed to be of a central location so it is an equal distance to travel for each neighbourhood.

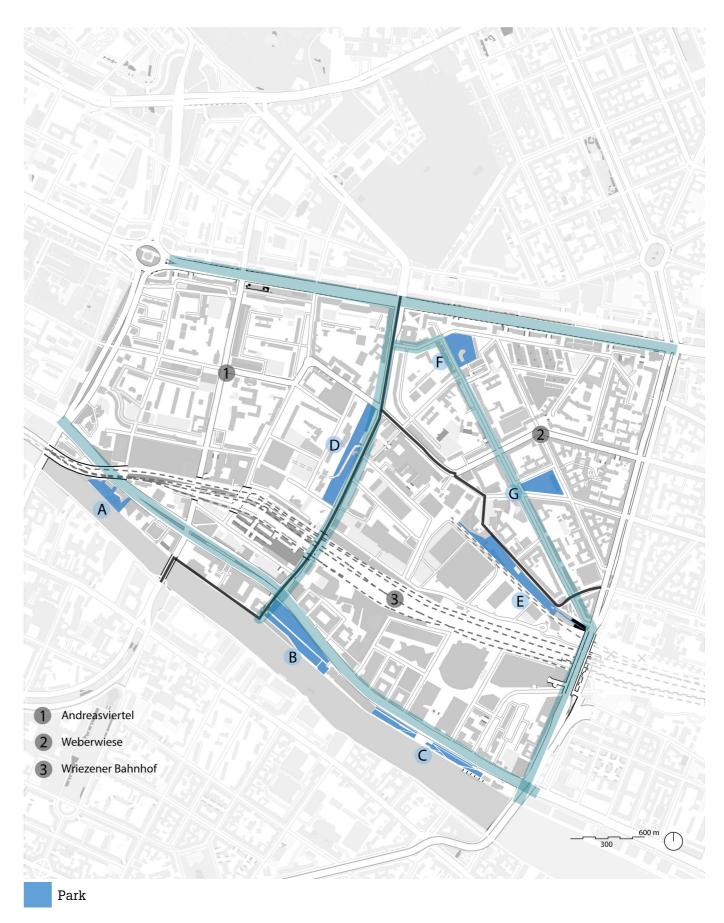

Within the neighborhood, there are several green public spaces. This is an important connecting element either as an aspect for people to interact and meet as a place to pass through going from A to B. The pictures indicate the differences between the functional green spaces. The next map shows that the parks are located mainly in the centre of the site area and in the south near the Spree river. The Holzmarkt 25 is a cultural center facilitating artistic cafes and food stalls. On the other hand the Berliner Mauer park is a memorial park.

The wriezener park houses different activities such as a skatepark and a soccer / basketball court. The other parks are more general state parks. Looking at the connection between and accessibility of the different type of parks, the main roads have been determined. Based on the different transportation routes, walking, cycling, public transport the map shows the main routes and connections between the parks that are accessible by at least 2 different type of transportation types. Especially the southern parks are well connected by the same main road.

Regarding my POTCLUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE, since there are few parks within the neighbourhoods and there seems to be a park designated to every neighbourhood for a specific demographic. My public condensor requires a large park that can connect some of the large green parks to include many different people and functions.

### Green Public Spaces



Through the kids profile, it is quite observant that the North-Western area of the neighbourhood house functions catered to kids. This cluster allows for an easy transition from one building to another without having to travel throughout the entire neighbourhood, promoting less commute especially for students. When mapping the different transit methods with this demographic, it was key to note that there was more accessibility via cycling, car, and walking which is useful for residents within the neighbourhood. However for residents who live out of the neighbourhoods, there are 2 main routes for inner neighbourhood public transportation (bus) and border transportation (metro).

From the anchor points of this demographic they possessed functions such as elementary schools, high schools, gymnasiums and playgrounds, sport fields. Particularly within

My POTLUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE strives to attract kids from the Andresviertal neighbourhood, to the centre of all 3 neighbourhoods. To avoid a cluster only in one neighbourhood. Also making the learning aspect central for not only kids but all ages and families.

#### Anchor Point Distance - Children



This profile was chosen, to target the age group of 18-30. to understand the areas of where the young demographic like to visit normally. The main cluster of buildings are around the perimeter of the neighbourhood and the Eastern and Southern area. Conveniently positioned close to the main public transport routes surrounding the neighbourhood tram, train and metro. While having numerous cycling and bus routes that navigate through the buildings on the Eastern end of the neighbourhood. Key to note that other than car and walking/ cycling to move from the Eastern to Southern area of the neighbourhood their is little to no public transportation, in the neighbourhood.

This criteria of buildings were chosen based on the hypothesis of a social young individual, who prefers socialize at clubs, galleries, restaurants and shopping. In addition with the everyday functions such as grocery shopping, hairdressers, and making activities.

My POTLUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE strives make a collective Public condensor that can bring most of these functions central making the Youngsters have a focused spot that they can hangout and learn and is the "epicentre" of all three neighbourhoods.

### **Anchor Point Distance - Youngsters**



When analyzing the worker profile, it was keen to notice that workers included the office and service industry. Which has a quite strong distinction within the neighbourhood. Being that most of the offices are located in the southern end of the neighbourhood, which can be easily accessed via train, car and public transportation, suggestively bringing in workers from around the city. While the North and and central workers being mostly service related, which is connected via cycling, walking and cars. Also having the main entrance to these areas via the Northern and inner main roads.

The criteria for workers, were functions of offices and firms, factory/making facilities, and commercial/service business. This wide scope of the term working facilities helped understand the different brackets of work that occupy not only the residents but outside locals as well. Which in turn brings more locals into the neighbourhood making it a diverse spot. These particular functions are

seen in the second diagram:

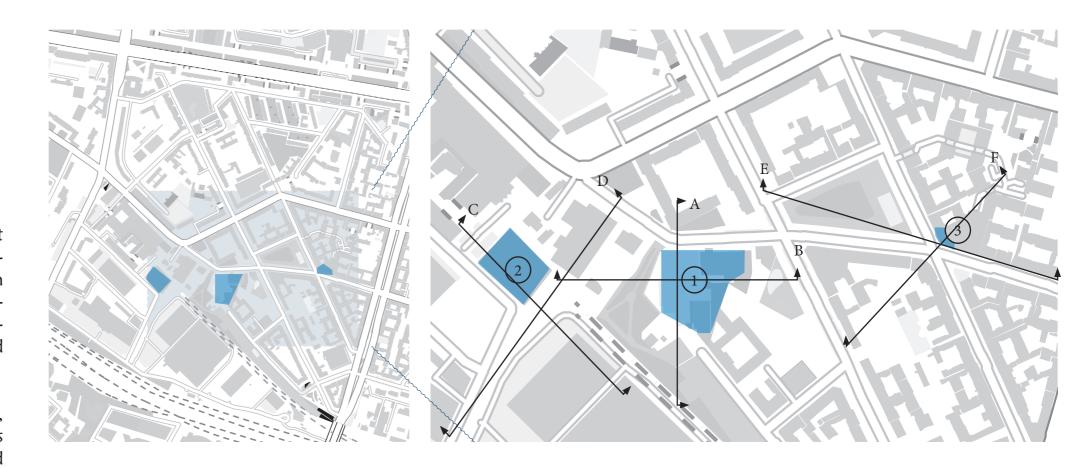


SITE LOACTIONS POTLUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE

As Berlin is the epicentre of Art within Europe, that is apparent to an outsider with the facades decorated with graphite and particular areas filled with music clusters and street artist. While the outer apparence is abviously engraved with art, it is not necessarly brought into the buildings for the locals and outsiders of the neighbourhood.

From the interviews and self viewed observations. the locals are quite happy with their surroundings being that they have most of the features needed in their neighbourhood. Though it is seen specifically that the younger generation (17-30), middle age generation (40-60), and adults without small kids, feels the neighbourhoods may need more artistic expression with open access to different cultures freely that can be expressed. This tells me that areas that are highly surrounded near schools, prefer to keep a quite and peaceful surrounding and if activities are neede locals prefer to go out their neighbourhood or in the active area for certain functions. Even the younger generation (20-30) do not mind meeting friends in a small cafe in the neighbourhood or go further on the outskirts of the neighbourhood for night functions. Elements that stood out that influenced my program for my public condensor is, lack of studio spaces of art, lack of green spaces, keeping the neighbourhood quite, brining interest to the old Berlin style (art plus night life) for tourist and locals.



The sites displayed were chosen based on their central location and proximity to cultural places and clear ability to attract different groups of people because of the parks. For the consideration of my POT-LUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE, all sites were fitting at the time.

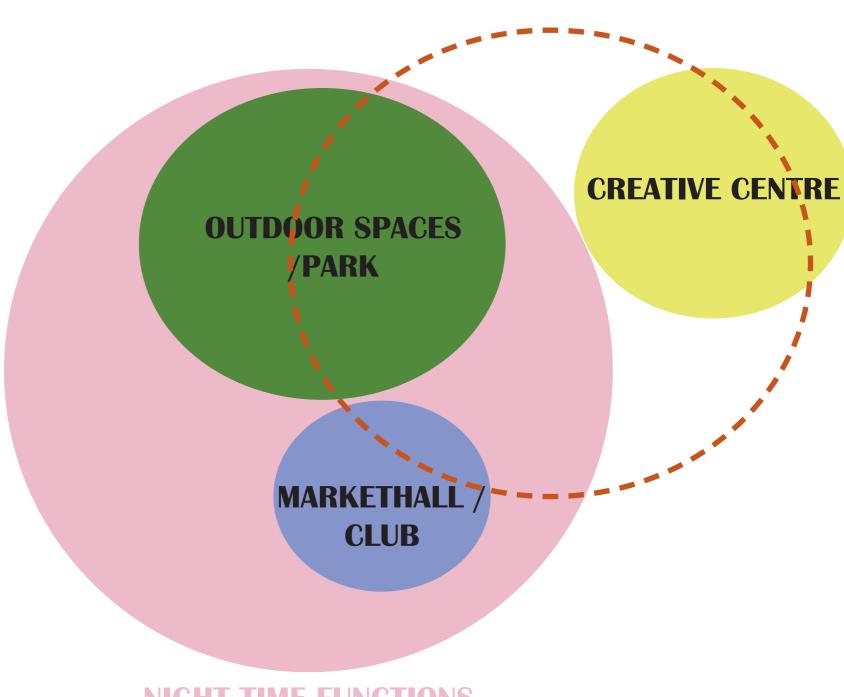

As for my concept I want to create different studio spaces for different fields of art, as in workshops for woodwork, painting, music stations, and areas to hold classes etc. Creating outdoor, indoor and combined workshop spaces. To also infuse the old style of art in Berlin, I would like to create a interior corridor that leads to different small clubs for different genres of music to attract many different people to let everyone feel included. Those spaces being clubs during the night while in the day they convert to large teaching spaces or a market hall. Allowing for a multicultural space having some days of the market hall for food, some for handmade products, interactive art exhibitions, thrift/flee market.

This program scheme later was refined with theoretical framework from the research plan to exhibit a more substantial and accurate analogy of a POT-LUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE.

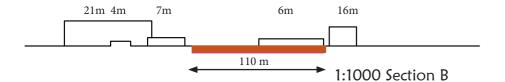

The physical Model represents my theoretical framework in how Informal and Formal Creative forms interact with one another. The Formal Creative form is the larger hoop where it consist of a institutionalized form that is clearly taken up more space than the informal and is mostly internal. While the informal creative form is the smaller hoop, meaning it has less space in Berlin for instance studios. By looking from each view point you get a different feel of each form.

Via looking from the formal onto the informal it is less visible, yet apparent, showcasing how formal art takes on attributes from the informal however isn't as flexible.

While looking from the informal to formal, it is almost magnified the viewpoint of the formal, showcasing that even in Berlin when looking from the individual artist standpoint, galleries are very abundant however not accessible to them.

However in-between the two hoops is an intersection, like a Venn diagrams, showing that the factor that connects these two forms is in fact greenery. Which is a key factor that I have taken in my program for the POTLUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE.



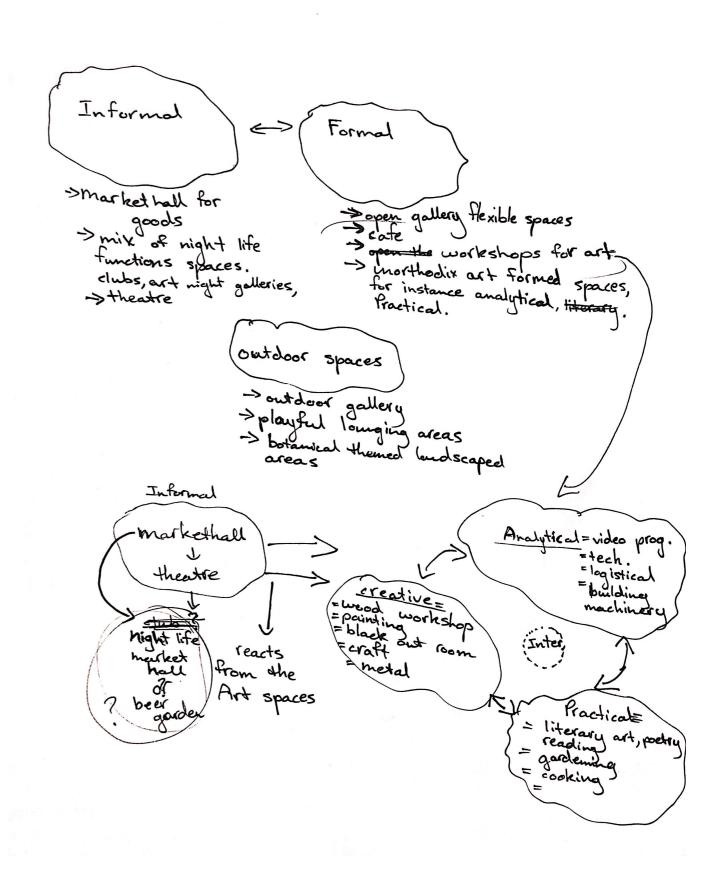

Regarding my POTLUCK: CREATIVE CENTRE, Site 1 seems to have spatial issues when balancing the green spaces and program buildings. Though works well having the market hall function near Berghain which, is kept in the final iterations for my Public Condenser. Another element that isn't ideal for my concept is the main road separating my functions, which ends up feeling segregated and inconvenient for people to cross a street to go to different buildings.

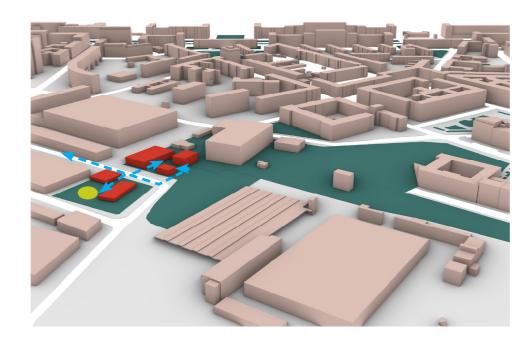


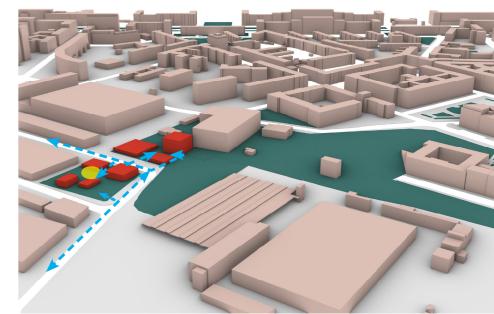
The physical model contains the theoretical attributes of my POTCLUCK; CREATIVE CENTRE. The tall slated cylinder represents the cultural aspects that are currently existing around my sites and there strong presence there already, for instance Berghain. The red flat ribbed circles represent the different functions I have in my program. The silver suspended rings represent the connecting wave lengths that allow for my programmed buildings to learn and interact with the sites existing functions. 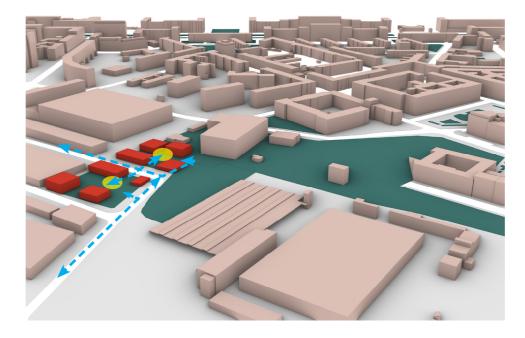


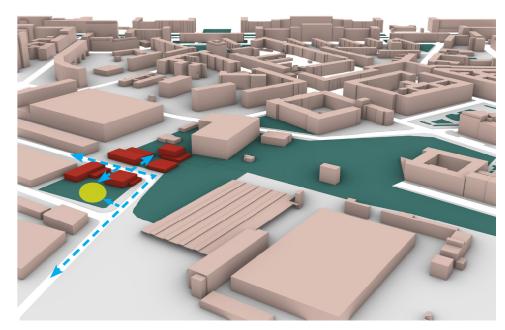

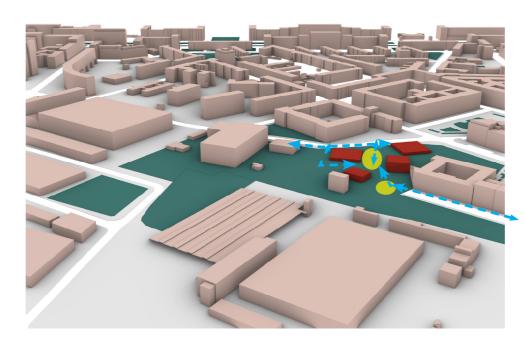
These are just a few iterations of trying different volume mass on Site 1, it is found that taller buildings near Berghain do not work as well as thought from plan. As well as clustered tall buildings near Berghain, take away from the monumental buildings and doesn't interact as well. Their is no proper viewpoints that attract people to this site because the buildings are so close that you can not individually take them in or read them as a mass in a park. A key element learnt is that some functions need to be added on top of another to avoid such a mass cluster. The next step is to then combine the best attributes from these iterations, and make one version that I can test the different programmed functions.

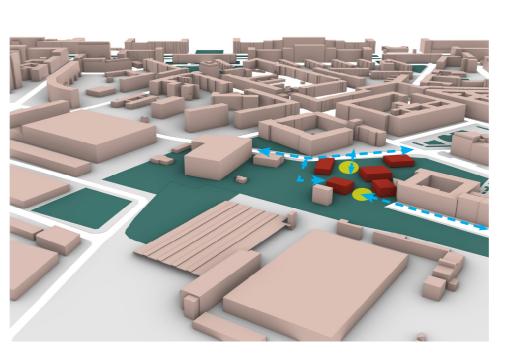


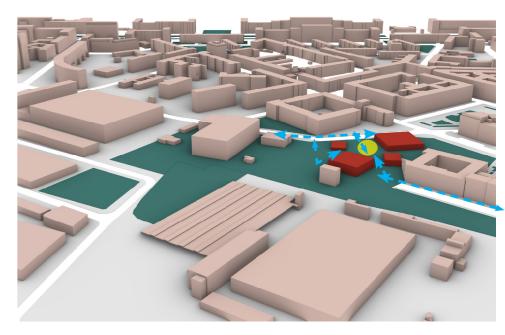


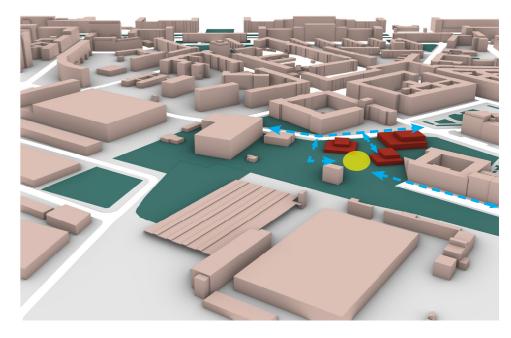

These are just a few iterations of trying different volume mass on Site 2, I have discovered that overall the taller volumes being nearer to the tall existing buildings works best in trying to blend in with the area. While leaving the middle forms lower in scale and more space for plazas and greenery the park doesn't get overwhelmed. Though having the volumes right against the existing roads, does not invite people in and makes the programmed buildings blend in to seamlessly with the surroundings. To invite people in and avoid my program being unrecognisable the volumes need to be pushed back from the road and the park needs to be more present. Or by making the ground floor pushed further into the site and the upper levels further to the road, it allows for the park and program to be visible. The next step is to then combine the best attributes from these iterations, and make one version that I can test the different programmed functions.





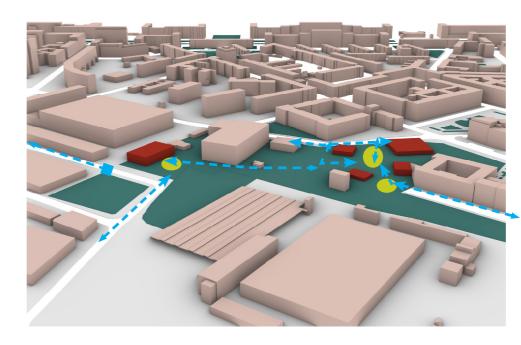


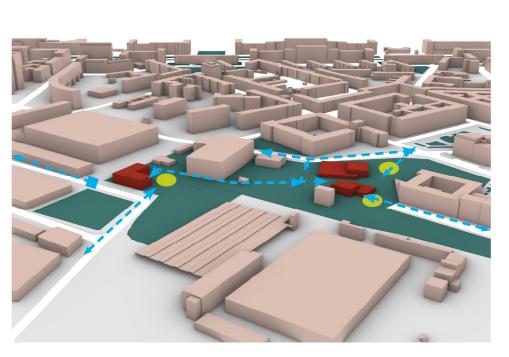


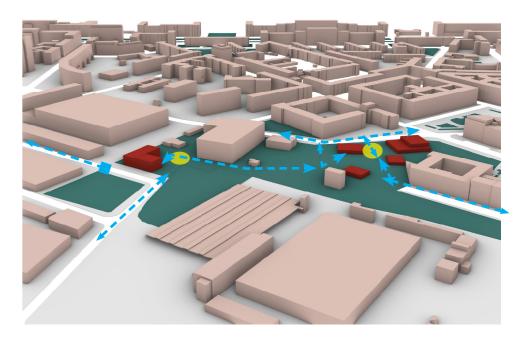

Also for the are near the fire station, it is best if there is a central plaza or two that allow for all the functions in that area to have a common walking and congregating space. Allowing for all the functions to have their individual functions but can overlap in outdoor spaces. The next step is to then combine the best attributes from these iterations, and make one version that I can test the different programmed functions.

#### **Problem Statement**

While Berlin has an expansive art output, its results have been eschewed after the unification. The Informal art form of expressing freely in abandoned or open spaces, for all to see and learn is being lost. The informal creative forms, for example, a street artist or individual artist with a craft are being suffocated by the formal art forms such as galleries, and museums. The informal art scene is normally displayed on the façade of the city through street artists and graffiti, however, is not being supported spatially. Which results in not enough exposure for certain creative ambitions and lessens the income for many informal creative outputs.

According to one study, after surveying 1,745 artists based in Berlin, 24% of men and 19% of women can cover their daily living costs. Leaving over 80% of these artists having to rely on other forms of income to suffice, stating that their art is a "lost business". <sup>1</sup>

This issue is mainly due to the recent real estate development and economic landscape, where studio spaces are rising in price and availability. Thus decreasing the number of spaces where, informal creatives can teach, make or display their creative skills. The concern from this is that informal creative forms, will not be organically passed through different people of various ethnicities, financial brackets, ages, interests, and genders.

#### **Importance Statement**

The importance is to make a creative center that supports all forms of creative expression. A public condenser which will add space for creative ambitions and give communal enjoyment (value), to the neighborhood. A condenser that is a potluck for all informal creative forms, where persons who practice these forms can teach, learn, and display. Giving a platform for informal art to be in an experimental grey zone where it can be measured, yet uncontrolled between spatial barriers (formal-enclosed and informal-exposed).

#### INTRODUCTION

The concept of a Public Condenser is to create a social space that can bring people in a shared purpose or program in one space that is currently lacking in such a place. The Potluck Creative Center strives to act as a Public Condenser that encourages the community to come together and learn, grow, and teach in an informal unpressured manner, within a relaxing outdoor park. To supply the users and residents of the Friedrichshain district, with a space that can be made by them for them, using an adaptable module. This module will become a prototype that encourages forgiving learning nature alongside structured spaces to make and teach informal art forms. This condenser becomes necessary not only for Friedrichshain but also for Berlin, as it provides not only space to teach and learn art but also space for artists and future makers to create without worry of their space being taken or out of financial reach.

The Potluck Creative Center was created through research methods including observation, quantitative study, case studies, interviews with Berlin residents, and research through literature, social media, pictures, and events. Focusing on research related to typologies/functions related to each informal creative form and how that is designed in a flexible formal setting.

#### BERLIN RESEARCH

When first visiting Berlin, it was apparent that the artistic culture was heavily engrained within not only the architecture but the formation of the city. From visiting famous clubs like Berghain, and underground middleage rock concerts/galleries, to visiting the Suicide Squad [culture hub]. The city embraced all ages, genders, and opinions through various informal artistic forms. The intricate level of communication amongst people within Berlin [workers, residents, youth, tourists] through architecture crossed with cultural means is unique and successful in Berlin. Using methods of posters, graffiti, and painted messages on the pathways.

However, while Berlin has an expansive art output, its results have been questionable after unification. The informal art form of expressing freely in abandoned or open spaces, for all to see and learn is being lost. The informal creative forms, for example, a street artist or individual artist with a craft are being increasingly outstripped by formal art forms such as galleries, and museums. While informal art scene is normally displayed on the façade of the city through street artists and graffiti and is known for its disappearance, which is key to a surplus amount of expressive art. This form, however, is not being supported spatially, with a lack of teaching and studio spaces for these types of art. Which results in not enough exposure for certain creative ambitions and lessens the income for many informal creative outputs.

This issue is mainly due to the recent real estate development and economic landscape, where studio spaces are rising in price and availability. Thus, decreasing the number of spaces where informal creatives can teach, make or display their creative skills. The concern from this is that informal creative forms will not be organically passed through different people of various ethnicities, financial brackets, ages, interests, and genders.

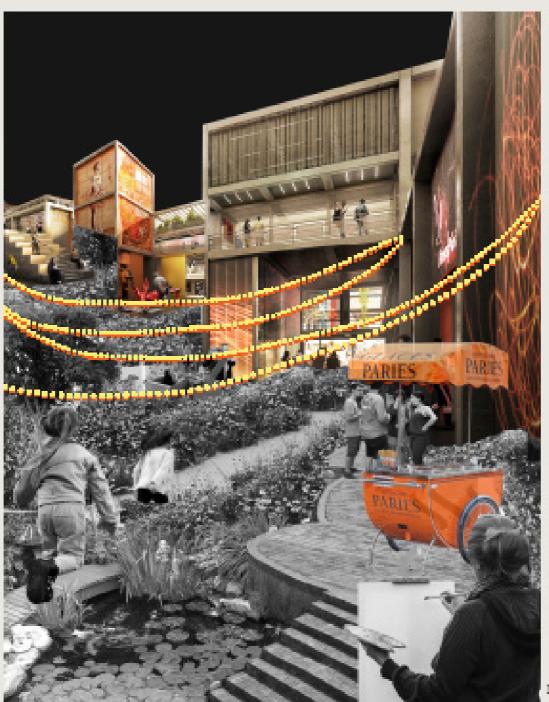


Psycho-Geography Map of Berlin

#### SITE RESEARCH

When exploring the Friedrichshain area for possible sites, with Berlin's first impression in mind, it was noted that the site needed two qualities to supply the use of my Public Condenser. A space for artists to make and a central location of the neighborhoods, for accessibility. With this first-hand view, a number of interviews were made with multiple residents, of various ages, professions, family statuses, and financial brackets, in order to gauge what they needed. The main comments highlighted were more green space, keeping quiet areas the same, and space to; make different arts, learn diverse crafts, and sell crafts.

This led to the chosen site, located near the Am Comeniuspl Common Platz and Berghain, to connect all three Neighborhoods and create a green carpet for the district. The advantage of the site is ample buildings surrounding the site [homeless shelter, theatre workshop, gymnasium, and Berghain]. These buildings already house an existing root in the community, and adding my Public Condenser will fill any gaps needed by the residents.

The site while located next to a park and a large residential/commercial area, also is attached to an industrial area of workshops and warehouses. This gives the site two drastically different atmospheres. During the day it is quiet and works solely as a small park with few visitors aside from a few walkers and passersby. While the night comes alive with festivals held in the park and nightclubs with lingering residents and visitors. Thus, having a condenser that brings more attraction during the day, while still leaving the lively atmosphere at night would further add rather than detract from the community.

#### RESEARCH QUESTION

How can various Informal Forms of Creativity be translated into places of flexible spaces of formality?

By using different methodologies, I discovered key elements that were needed to further deepen my design concept by answering a few key sub-questions. To further solidify my concept, I visualized my design as a Potluck, comparing every design and research stage tied to this analogy.

Can the archipelago theory of Berlin be translated into a master plan to further support my Potluck concept?

The suggestion from one of my tutors was to read the text *The Archipelago City: Piecing together Collectivities* and discover how the Archipelago theory thrived in Berlin and how it could relate to my Potluck. Leading to and off the P2 stage the archipelago theory was an integral part of my design. By studying how the archipelago theory in Berlin explains that following the war, dispersed significant buildings were selected due to their architectural or cultural significance and connected through networking. This was applied to the Potluck concept where the creative pillar buildings were not physically connected, though connected through a master plan (landscape interventions). This analogy of the archipelago was scrapped after P2 and later evolved into looking at my Potluck Creative Centre as a Campus for making and learning. The Campus concept strengthened my Public Condenser to instead of idolizing separation, it leaned towards connection through function to the Existing functions on site.

How can I input the Potluck Analogy into Architectural Form?

To first gather the initial concept, I researched the analogy of a Potluck. Through an existing interview, it was viewed that the "Potluck is a time-honored tradition that makes most of us pull out our slow cookers, dust off our festive-themed holiday serving dishes, and indulge. However, it's also a time when the best of intentions go awry, from raw chicken to accidental babysitters." This text became

the foundation of what my Potluck concept can add to the neighborhood, a place to gather, bring skills, experiment, fail and learn without judgment.

[*Text Book Definition*] Potluck: A <u>communal</u> meal to which multiple people bring a <u>collection</u> of different <u>dishes</u> to share in <u>one space</u>.

[Concept Definition] Potluck: Joining multiple creative forms to make one space of learning, making, and expressing in an experimental Public Condenser.

The phrase Potluck will architecturally be broken into the most important conceptual elements:

Dishes: Separate creative pillars

Communal: Centre for the community

One space: Park

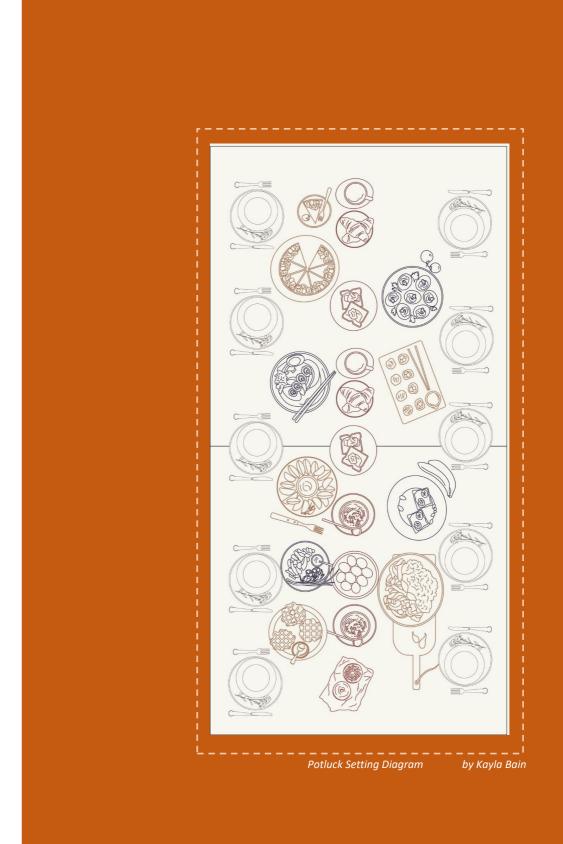

What are the potentials for informal learning?

Through the research of various precedent studies of workshops and creative centers paired with interviews of Berlin residents and artists. There is a clear need for programs that can make a creative space not only useful but progressive. Space to learn:

- 1. Creative forms such as painting, sculpting, etc., [creative]
- 2. Experimenting in an open format and learning business modules for the art [analytical]
- 3. Researching through literature and learning practical skills [Literary/Practical]

Along these 3 pillars, other programmatic elements were later added between the P1 and P2 stages, of workshops, market areas, and a public realm. The research was then conducted through a manner of volumetric study if rather the scheme worked as one building or separate elements. With the potluck analogy, the scheme was viewed as a 'table setting' the landscape - table and building- dish, utensils- outdoor activities. Allowing my Potluck to integrate multiplicity through flexible functions and allowing the users of my Condenser to not only interact with the building but the park as well. A precedent study was conducted to decipher which types of rooms were needed in a creative, literary, and analytical space; classrooms, private library spaces, studios, workshops, and open exhibition spaces.

How can informal art translate in a didactic capacity?

For the later stage of P2 and P3, the Potluck analogy was then broken into what core ingredients were needed for my buildings-dishes to succeed. 5 elements were highlighted which produced 10 ingredients. These ingredients allow the informal art to take to be structured in a way that can change with the neighborhood's needs and allows for flexible teaching spaces that can be formal based on the user's requirements and wants.

- 1. Population and Growth:
- Open Space- More green space to allow for future development,
- Food- Urban Farming
- 2. Community:
- Education- Open learning, classroom, making.
- Identity and Belonging- space for creatives to grow and make space their own
- 3. Technology:
- Adaptability- Flexible module on a grid that allows for spaces to be made to fit the user
- Integrative Design- Users have decisions on how their space is formed
- 4. Health and Wellbeing
- Economic prosperity- allowing users the space to learn business modules and sell goods.
- Social Safety- Judgment-free zone to learn without the fear of making space being taken away.
- 5. Climate Change
- Biodiversity- after P3 it was suggested to incorporate my landscape more within my buildings. Hence a wetland was incorporated to provide energy for the building and create an ecosystem. Also using bio-diverse building materials
- Resource Efficiency- Urban Mind Materials incorporated within the landscape and new buildings.

#### FRAMEWORK CONCEPT

The basic framework of the Potluck Creative Center is to create a modular design that is simplistic in design that can in the future be used in other projects elsewhere. The system is not customized to the site however will have various wall configurations that can work for other programs and places. By using a post and beam construction, steal connectors, a Lignatur flooring system, and prefabricated wall elements. This allows for easy future additions and dismantling for a circular building cycle. This concept embraces the use of urban mined materials from existing buildings being demolished on-site, to be used within the building.

From the feedback after P3, it was encouraged to keep a flexible and simple structure that focused on a few architectural design decisions that embraced the sustainable design. Implementing sustainable strategies such as solar panels, bio-based materials, urban mined materials, rain and stormwater collection, and energy from watermills in wetlands. From this the Potluck Creative Center is split into 5 phases: Demolish/Urban Mine, Landscape, Ground Buildings (Creative Building, Café and Workshop), Buildings above Wetland (Analytical and Practical Buildings), Building Additions, and added levels.

Programmatically the final concept will join through one common theme which is to learn through making and doing, which can be centered around certain programs. The center will be rigid through set classes that teach certain trades by local artists; however, the spaces will obtain a certain fluidity and flexibility that can be transformed by the users. To match the ever-fast changing pace of the artist scene in Berlin, where it is to make, exhibit, and take down in certain spaces for seasonal and purposeful occasions. This Creative Centre is imagined to be an independent and useful tool for Berlin, which allows users to freely create, experiment, learn, and market their skills and products. This gives the existing artist the space to both create and profit from their skills, while also teaching and nurturing Berlin's output of the new and aspiring artists.

#### RELEVANCE OF GRADUATION WORK

The importance is to make a creative center that supports all forms of creative expression. A Potluck Creative Center will add space for creative ambitions and give communal enjoyment (value), to the neighborhood. A condenser for all informal creative forms, where persons who practice different forms can teach, learn, and display. Giving a platform for informal art to be in an experimental grey zone where it can be measured, yet uncontrolled between spatial barriers (formal-enclosed and informal-exposed).

The scope of my project is to create a framework to base a creative module form. The design will create a prototype that can be used in other projects to result in structured informal learning. Creating a program that can combine and transform how different creative forms are viewed on a broader scale in the competence level of professions. This architectural design is to showcase that massing forms should embrace special features based on location to create a successful site addition, while the module/prototype can allow the program, and interior design to embrace flexibility.
