




# architecture as infra-structure

"Infrastructure is understood here as the entirety of all large superb public facilities, which systematically organize the essential comings and goings and services of expression in the city.





MASP and the 9 de Julho avenue in the valley below. 1980











São Paulo's population in 1900 **240.000** 






São Paulo's metropolitan population in 2024 **23.000.000** 



Mayor Prestes Maia's Avenues Plan, 1948






Robert Moses' urban plans for São Paulo, 1951








Guarapiranga and Billings reservoir, on the left and right respectively




