It was a crisis cos no one had money to build anything So that was the moment for us to decide that we shouldn't make a list of what we want as a city, but we ask the markt

- developers to ask what would be a great idea to develop on that plot

They had to show that it would be a good thing on that plot too

And for this process we asked from the beginning to the end that the people living in the area to join us

The first time we go out was telling them which process we wanted to do

We also wanted input from there

In that first moment they ask us "isn't there some plan already? Can we see something?"

But there was nothing cos we just wanted to start the process and first share it with them and hear from them what they have to say about the process

Cos people always want nice things but not in my backyard So on that evening these were the kind of things they told us

After the first step we selected three developers that they had a vision on the plot that we thought were nice Municipality/ Developers/ Environment (people) - three groups involved so to say

My team had a vision (not that we want three houses or so specific)

But vision as a city and about how we should develop as a city and how that area can help develop Delft in the right direction We explained this to the people and told there which process we will follow and we told them we will search for developers who can join us in that with good visions So first was to search developers - we got 11 - and we chose 3 to go with us to the next step With those three we go to the environment We told the dev that they should tell people who live

there, what they wanted to do with that plot That was first thing for dev cos they never did this

Tender with a twist First them they had to present to the people in a room,

with other two competitions also So one night ask them to present what they wanted what they thought was a great plan for the plot

People who were there that evening told us they felt it was a great idea

They could look in 3 visions and give input by each plan They told us there is one plan that if that would be the final one - they would be against it!

That is all the time here

But we heard it and we explained them that it is not a tender but as a city we have to go transparent and each party has to get equal chances

Second round: we ask three dev to come back to the people with revised plans and why they did that

Also invited the environment to come talk with dev Still that one plan was not good and they didn't like it but we saw it ourselves too that this one dev didn't listen to what people had to say, it was that city wants money so we have to go high and sky is the limit!

We have the criteria on which we would select the plan The devs knew this and also the environment

How you came up with this criteria?

As a city we cannot just sell the plot to the first one who knocks on our door

(1) So we have to show this plan fits the city and environ-

(2) Show it is feasible and realistic, they have a solid business case that is viable

(3) Show what they had done with the input they heard from the people

But people always say but we want to select But we explain this is not possible, because we have to look to the money as well

That is a difficult point to explain

I understand why they want to choose, But we have to explain to them that we use it as one of the selection criteria but thats what we can do

Making the criteria?

Is the team at municipality that makes it But the municipality has to consider and report to many places: people, council, internal, jurisdiction rules that they have to comply to

How would i do this again?

In future if we do something like this again, then we would go earlier to people

cos now we had a vision from our team - it didn't describe what we wanted, but still this step we should have done with the people who lived there

How will you give people the voice?

Because we have a lot of rules within which we have to operate, but how can we give them a voice in that setting? You have very little room within the current framework And other problem is that the neighborhood wasnt organized - so who do you invite?

We did this by seeing the diameter of area and those people get letter at home, and message in the local paper so rest of the city also knows

About 15 people turned up for first round Second round city council asked to invite whole city But someone living here didn't care much of what is happening in that area

Currently sold the plot and it is being developed now Was the plan that the environment was also satisfied with

Other projects applied this to?

Around 6 years ago there was a street next to which a plot was being developed

The street needed to be redeveloped

This is in 2012

But everyone in municipality was like no we won't do this with the environment

I said we should do it with people But it was not possible in this building back then

That was my first step in thinking of how can we get people into our project

We say everyone has to join us, think with us, do with us, together we make the city. But the reality is that someone wants to replace a bench outside his home but he needs to talk for 5 hours to get it done

There is room for people to decide only if we want to give the room

We ask all kinds of participation from people and in the end there is nothing changed

Because I think we are really convinced that we know it better

When we talk about participation we only want to tell our own story and convince people that our story is the best story and that we know it better because we are equipped and knowledgeable

So if people are having arguments about the things we decide then we only listen to convince them that they are wrong

So if you really look at arguments then your plans and policies they really become better

If you really listen to people then you can understand what they really want and get the question behind the question and if you are convinced that makes your idea better then it is really diff how you approach people Participation is about talking to lot of people and saying

what do you want? And mostly everybody wants something but mostly they didn't get the right tools or knowledge to make a good thought about what we really need When we don't invest in the relation and getting them on the same level of knowledge that we have, everything they are gonna say is stupid

I don't believe in participation with giving info to large group of people But if you take the time to tell people we are gonna make something happen together, but can you take the time to listen to another point of view, are you prepared to not think only about your point of view but look what is better for delft?

Are you willing to invest time, are you committed, do you trust us? Are you willing?

And you don't talk only with them but put the group together all your stakeholders, and make a journey together So we meet each other, trust each other get to know each other

We are here together to get the best results

Every argument is not about fighting for something but to learn from it and put it in your result to make it better

That is very intense process and project and takes a lot of your personal life also

But then it is possible to really make a group and connect with each other

But then I need trust of the government and my boss as well

#### Station Delft zuid is near that plot

But we use it and we are looking at it within the total development of the station area

(He has drawn out a map in my paper to explain the different plots in that area)

There is station delft zuid in center, around it is 6000 sq mt plot, certitudo plot, schieovers noord, park and ride plot

The park and ride is at this moment but not necessarily to stay there

And also the tunnel to be from station to schievoers

6000 sq mt is the explicit plot for me, that we have to sell it

But we are asking the developer to think with us not only on this area but also the bigger picture

There are lots of stakeholders as well: NS, Pro rail, certitudo, social housers, owners of houses, municipality, business men

And everyone has his own willingness and thoughts of how to develop this area

And their own interests

Our goal is to get all these people on the same table with the same goal on the future looking for the same development of this area for the future

In first I was asked just to focus on the plot, but then soon we said to each other that if we just focus on the plot it wont work, we have to focus on a more integrated area Now PM for this plot but involved with total area dev

According to you most important dev that needs to happen:

Looking for intensity

Now is more open but looking for more mass on this plot Mixed use area with living, working, retail, entertainment Within municipality we have agreements of the clustered shopping areas in the city of Delft, so now if we want to increase this then we have to make a discussion again to see if everyone is willing and this is possible

I think it's necessary to bring facilities over here but municipality has to make decisions here

In summer 2019 we would like to have the developer we select for this plot and with this developer we would like to have the planning more concrete

And what we are doing now as a municipality is defining the boundaries (boundary conditions) within which we are able to make this developments

And that is what we are doing with Marco Broekman (urban designer)

So with them we are deciding what we would like to have on these spots but not planned the details

Talks about the eight ambitions, i see these ambitions as the boundary conditions

So within these ambitions we are asking the developers we are selecting to visualize and make concrete with us, for the execution

Now we are very wide and visionary but at a point it has to go to execution

And this process to get to execution we want to get to with the developers and surroundings

"With us" what does that mean for you?

Originally the municipality decides we need schools, or we houses etc and then all these ingredients need to get placed in this area. And then later the municipality says okay here is where the school will be etc

But now we are looking for a developer who can tell us what they think, where it should be Dialogue with developer and surroundings Surroundings to think with us

Now if we have a white wall then we will have hundreds of ideas, that is why we think the 8 ambitions are necessary to set the boundaries

We want mobility for ex, but how it all fits in within this area then we work with the developer and surroundings to make that

Something that it ends up such that most people are happy with it

That it is a product not just of government but of everybody in this area

And that's what we are trying to do from this summer Deciding now how do we get what partner selected For selecting developer looking into things such as: Does the developer have skills, financials, experience etc to make that what he says he can make?

The difficulty of where we are now, the city council, the alderman - so we make the decision

I am asking my decision people to think out of their regular way of work

So the difficulty now is to tell city council, please do trust us we are making something great together here, we will inform during the process and there are few decision points where you can make your decision. But for now we ask you to give us your permission and trust us to make this way of work a success.

There are moments where they are like ok, why not. But then also moments of doubt.

So we have difficulties of decision making within the municipality as well

Citizens and people of the city, how do you see their involvement?

Very intense

City council made decision one year ago that every spatial dev within city of Delft needs participation So they introduce Delfts Doen for this reason

So they say everything needs to be done with participation of your citizens

So Delft is a fore runner in this participation approach So Delft has become kind of an example for this, and everyone in Netherlands is looking at us now because we started from scratch and now we develop this

Applied participation in any project?

Has not applied in his projects here because he is specifically working on this plot now

But gives example of previous project of another colleague De Stijl (?) (Fidan Bulut) did in a plot near IKEA Its a plot from city Delft where they were developing something

There they involved citizens early on, to participate In there they were thinking about the boundaries with the surroundings...to think with us what are these boundaries? Pulled them early on in this process

So it did work out but it took quite a long time to get to concrete plans and with these plans we selected the developing partners So here we thought (current project) we switch it around and do selection process with our developing partner Mainly cos of time issue

Not that we think this best decision, but we are learning from it, what is the right moment and conditions to involve your citizens

#### Ideal Participation process for him?

We are aiming for involving all other stakeholders as well, in this project

But if you go to people and ask..we have a plot here, what do you want? Then everyone will say something...then the result of the participation will be very wide and you can't make plans that will cater to everybody and what everybody wants?

So i think the ideal is you give choices and you have to be clear and honest about what people can't participate on For ex, we can say it is necessary to dev 200 apts on that plot. So that is one of the boundaries then. And we can say, this has to be combined with any function you can think of.

So we have options then like..make small homes, or high rise buildings etc. So then you can tell the surroundings there is one thing certain that we will have 200 apt but we ask you what kind of buildings you want?

So that is the way to participate, give people choices, So they know where they can and where they cannot participate?

Why choices? How does it help them?

There are individual needs and wants

And then there are collective needs and wants

And we as a municipality are responsible for collective
needs and wants. And it can be that the collective needs
and wants over shadow individual ones

That's what i mean by yes we give them choices, but we let them know what is being done for the collective good.... that this is necessary to develop. But within this, you can participate: it can be aesthetical choices, functional, or about program and process

It is more to direct the participation than to help the participants

I don't think you can or should give choices to help them (that it is either this or nothing)

But yes..good question..how do these participates experience this way of participation?

What are the challenges for the participants? This is the difficulty of participation

You have to make sure that they have a feeling that they are participating on issues that make sense to them, gives them a feeling of this is what i need and what would be good for me

But how far can you go to make their individual goals part of the collective goals?

That's why i think it is necessary to make these specific for participants

This is kind of a grey area..because where is the shifting point for that?

Of course people have to get good feeling from the participation

But you can't give them everything, so looking for what's best and what suits for this area and how do we get that into the process?

The collective goals is the responsibility of the municipality to decide

In the city council meetings people get involved and they say I dont want this here or this there, and city council says that we do what we can to consider everyones views But then we have to function as a city, as a dense area so some decisions have to be made

#### Involvement of citizens

You should involve citizens as early or as often as you can Every decision the alderman and city council makes, gets published, so everybody can know what the decisions are But in this transformation it is necessary to tell the plan who get involved, to know about the plans, think about the plans and participate on the plans

So what is the right moment? Dont know for sure In a way this is a battle for us, because with Natasha and communication team they tell us...Joris isn't this a moment to involve citizens but I say it could be or no or yes! From their perspective they think why not do some participation today for making these boundaries But what I say is...these are the more collective issues and goals and within these we can do participation, once we have made our goals

Otherwise our goals go everywhere

"Let somebody think about what color we give the white wall, and you have lots of diff ideas"

#### Insights from participation

We are focusing on Delft zuid and also on Schieovers and we are in middle of participation process with the surroundings

We make notes of what comes out of this participation

#### But what we do is note everything that comes to us So with that we need to answer those: what do we do with what people want or think

And there are lots of things we want to do and plant and implement in our planning, but also things we wont
So it is also a dialogue between municipality and citizens
So we do use the insights as and when we implement what people give us

But in some points we dont use it and then we tell those people why we dont use it, So we explain what we do with the inputs of those participation

I think inclusiveness helps plans be the best plans My definition of inclusiveness is that city development where everybody has a good feeling with

As i experience the process of getting to real development now, what I am interested in is, when development is completed, and people are using that what we made with each other is that inclusiveness too?

Planning  $\rightarrow$  Implementing  $\rightarrow$  Using (he talks about this loop in some way)

And then in the future can the usage influence the planning somehow

How do we get guarantee that what we are thinking about now, really gets implemented and the way of using it is the way we are thinking about it now?

Connection between inclusiveness and participation? I think inclusiveness is participation

But that is my personal translation of this

"Not as a goal as it is, but because you are sure this is the best way and best process to implement"

And inclusiveness is a plan you make with everyone included

Don't get stuff out of these participation nights

If we build something our self we also organize participation things to get all stakeholders on board People living in and around these areas

Tensions currently?

No tensions yet because plans are not so concrete yet But there will be later on, specially in areas where too many companies and stakeholders are involved

How do you deal with this not being open to new ideas? Starts with a conversation What are people afraid of?

What's in it for them? To show them the opportunity in it for them

You have to look for leverage and listen very carefully to stakeholders

But to make sure everyone puts these agendas on the table and not hide it

So, Honesty

Trust: if someone thinks I have an hidden agenda then what I am saying wont matter, so imp to talk to stakeholders to create an atmosphere of openness's. How? Keep in contact, listen, make them feel heard and then you are really connected.

They take their time, that helps. Don't put pressure on stakeholders.

It is important to have some kind of plan in place.

So we go to school we have co-creation sessions with them...to get information and their opinion on how the city of delft should develop

Make a special program for them to participate Even with 80 + people because someday they will get sick and the city needs to know how to help them then And then we use focus groups - pick them up and have a special meeting

All about making it possible for everyone who is important and those that want to talk to us, to give them that opportunity

That's how we try to include everyone with participation project

In what moment does the participation team get involved

#### in a project?

Main goal is to be involved at earliest stage of a project that is ideal situation

But that is not always the case. Sometimes they want to first build the business case

But then if we are not the ones who take the initiative, then we tell the dev that they have to start the process with DD

Cos we want people to participate

Nice to start at the point of the ambition doc Ambition doc is never with a clean state because people think there is always a plan - which is true cos there is things like money involved, law etc which you are dependant on

So if we go with a clean slate then people don't trust you. Don't come with a white. They like the transparency, is the most important to being take serious. Then there's the democracy

When we developed DD they said don't come with a clean slate, just tell us the boundaries what can and cannot be talked about

They like the transparency

And most imp is they want to know that they are being taken seriously (one of the main issues)

And then eventually you can have democracy and go to a more formal way of making a decision if needed

#### Someone from Hoegschool Utrecht.

She investigates the two participation projects there on the theory Personal Justice, is a theory in which people can be happy about the process but not agree on the outcome And it's all about the way you treat people

If people are not feeling that they were not treated right or not being taken seriously, then it has a huge effect on how they will continue with us

Communication with citizens?

Open

Transparent

Honest

Should be as early as possible

#### Conflicts with colleagues?

People think it's still scary to talk to people If people say yes or maybe then we are okay but if people say no - then the municipality gets scared that why are they saying no, or why don't they like our plan?

We know what is best for the city

But thats why it is a change of attitude that is needed And not every colleague is still there in that way I can see that the attitude is changing towards a positive position

Because they see that it is not that scary

And even if people say no - it means you have engagement If people don't want to engage anymore or react to anything then that is a very bad sign for you as a local government

Slowly the shift of attitude is happening

Omsgevingswet is designed to make more things possible Now we say that's a great idea and we will find a way to make it possible

Earlier it was like but there is this and this and this law and rule to look into

So now more is possible

We are using serious gaming insights for colleagues too With practical cases to make them talk about what would you do in this situation and how would you do it? So mix group of colleagues and it opens the dialogue and makes people more conscious

To talk about it and how to deal with it

How do you see the involvement of municipality with the citizens?

We try to involve them in the most earliest stage Delfts Doen, Right to challenge

We also have an Omsgevings manager - who knows everyone in one neighborhood

So she is the one connection between the environment and municipality - so everyone goes to her is something.

Minister said couple of months ago that municipality should work with the right to challenge initiative We participate in their projects (Governmental participation)

Citizen participation

Example where participation didn't work so well? Museum Prinsenhof

The city wanted to redevelop the museum to make it sustainable

But they wanted to remove a piece of the wall But people said noo I was married there etc - so it becomes an emotional thing, there.

This summer 4000 people at the square of museum that people wanted to protest

That's really a large engagement!

What we did wrong: The participation started too late. It was not a real participation process even cos there was nothing else to participate, not much left to participate Now we try to start the process from the beginning so that is better

How did you restore the trust?

They committed themselves to this project.

New perspectives, they will present to us, and then we have to see how serious we are going to take this input. And it can be tricky because if we don't consider the insights then we lose trust

And the question is then that 35 people, does the city trust its people? Does this group trust us as local government? So it's a really vulnerable process

What is the motivation to keep participating?

Participation is a right not a duty

If you don't care then you don't have to come. It is not an obligation

You (municipality) have to facilitate the process If there was a participation with less turn out - then maybe we didn't organize the process well? If it is at night people with kids cant come, so we have to facilitate the process better.

Tanthof example

The municipality felt that so many people want to participate so it is a bad sign. They were shocked that so many people don't agree with us and they want to say stuff But for us, this is great engagement cos in tantof people living are those who live all their life there

So this is great engagement and you should embrace it They don't have trust in the government.

If the whole city does not come at all then democracy is dead.

Lack of trust in the parties.

A shift on the type of parties. Is an expression of not being happy. Every two years we measure the confidence and trust of people in local government in delft and it is kind of low right now.

Do this using a survey

One of the things is that We were almost bankrupt, because we built the new station but then we got into a financial crisis and taxes were high, so the people don't trust the local government because they have to pay more now

Insights from participation - internally within municipality? We give Internal workshops to different departments. Do you have some cases from ur direct working experience on which we can try DD?

Let them experience how to use DD in their daily work Cos it is direct and practical they get enthusiastic Diff dept diff approach since their work is diff so I let them experience how they get enthusiastic. Every department is different, they have a different

#### Challenges?

It's costing a lot of money, people will still say no to the plans

They are scared a little

And it is new so people have to get used to everything that is new

**Building trust** 

But you also see the change.

Made an escape room for omsgevingswet. Borrowed From Breda and they really liked it. To learn about it and learn about working together

If you use interactive tools then people get excited

Ideal scenario?

If we would use the tool of participation at the most earliest stage

And if we use it seriously.

After participation there should be some development

(beofre and after using participation) the plans should change

People must notice, if there is not difference ... then it is not well applied

people should see we did something from their input Looking at the changes we can still make to give their input serious place in the plan

How do you give feedback?

Have an excel sheet where all the comments are written down

We put comments to their comments to say we use your input for...or didn't use ur input for....

Give feedback personally

And during 7th May wrap up meeting and discuss 5 dilemmas

How much room is there for change still?

It depends of the type of project

Schieovers is really large area and we don't own much ground there

We can directly influence parts that are ours We are dependant of the business.

But some parts they will become apt flats (from certitudo)
We are gonna start participation process there now but
after the business case was made and signed
The dev is making branding and marketing already

The dev is making branding and marketing already
So then we told them that people won't take it seriously cos they have images of what looks like brochure images
So people won't feel good if u have that and then ask them
If you are demolishing a building here then you have to
give back something to them

They would properly do the placemaking.

To every project is different.

We want to put so many houses, because there are large companies. People will complain. But now we been talking about. It's a really long-term process. Be disruptive. It can be a simple thing, it depends on so many. It's a real political process.

You have to earn the trust from everybody It can be one thing and then it can be totally disrupted suddenly

With businesses

If business is initiative taker we out that they have to use DD in the initial agreement

They are not used to doing that

Scarv

People are always complaining

But I sit with them and tell them there are participation policies even if there is a business case

Sometimes you have to keep your back straight and say

that the city needs this so we have to do it this way
As a government, because the city needs this

You have to show that this is a precarious process. More is possible.

They have to get used to it and experience what are the

possibilities and get a positive experience

So even with dev u see they are getting enthusiastic It is a new way of doing and working for them as well It's better to know the arguments against your plans at the beginning of the process that later

Also helps you get new ideas for your plans

We as city council often have blank spots But people outside, of the city, they have creative ideas that we never thought about

It can enrich your plans

If they see it is little extra effort but if it makes a diff then they are happy to work with it

DD is new so we help them to design the process We learn everyday

Start was weird

Make a mix with the government so then we had to really make up our mind on what we want here

It is an extensive area with lot of diff kind of stuff going on Not much employee per sq meter

More housing in Delft

The development plan started then around 2 years ago So now we have participation on this, the planning is just before summer to decide if it is okay and then we go ahead (11 July)

In the two years we had elections the council changed So they made some other decisions in the planning and chose 4 areas in delft where they want to make the priority Schieovers is one, area with hospital, Delft zuid, New delft (central station)

Delft zuid is part of the schieovers transitions

Delft zuid is more living and schieovers in general is more working

The development around the station can be independent of schievovers because of this they separated it. Why? Speed of development can be quicker is separate delft zuid as separate area

Municipality is owner of few plots but that is in schieovers Boundaries of the COP we get a lot of questions about can we do something here? Or can we build something here? So now prices of these houses are going way high (the strip they bought – anne knows)

They also need guarantee from the municipality that they will get the money from it, otherwise it is not really interesting from them to buy

So now they have to wait till the main plan is decided before summer and then make arrangements with the other parties (such as Leo)

ect, not process)

Also the tunnel but it will really far from the square so then when they leave the tunnel the way it is currently planned they come up into nothing

We want the square like people can come together there to have coffee etc

The tunnel project has been commissioned in Jan 2020 they start. So we still have sometime to stop them or make some changes to that...

What can we do to open it up, or widen it to get people to come there

Not just people that are travelling but also from voorhof or tanthof that they can come there and go to gym or do their groceries etc

For now the square is one of our main challenges Square sounds easy, but its something that u have to make a lot of decisions before you can start thinking of this square

Like do we want to develop this plot? Or make it into a park or something? So what to do with the tunnel? Does it make it too long to get to the station then? Where will the bike parking be?

So really need to make a lot of decisions first And we have to think about what do we want in 30 or 50 years

Trying to make "no regret decisions"

All parties are thinking from another perspective Everyone has common goal of wanting to develop the place into something good and "magical"

But then Certitudo (company from den bosch) wants to develop it fast because they want people in certain part cos they want development there

And another org thinks same but in their side And Pro rail wants a tunnel and 4 tracks

Can tunnel move? No..few years ago when decision was made the municipality didn't have money. And now the plan is already better than it was before

NS: wants to have good stations, partner in 4 track project but they are letting pro rail take the charge. Now it is not even 5000 travellers a day, so it is not so interesting for NS to think of installing shops etc there.

Pro rail: installing and making tracks

Thoughts about sustainability: everyone wants to think of it but it is not their priority. When you look at the whole strip then it is interesting to think of this, but not if you think about just one plot. Want to reuse the schiehola? Everyone wants to do something with sustainability but they all are doing it in their own way...like Pro rail with the roof, and certitiudo with circular demolishing...

Leo the billboard near delft zuid, it is quite prominent and then it feels like it is coming there like tomorrow!

And normal, regular people don't realize or know whats going on, because they don't read all these articles and documents about it

Everyone was really negative about naming it campus, and that was the sentiment

It was really negative and really small focused. They didn't ask other questions about like..how can we get there? Will there be elevators etc.

How would you evaluate the (participatory) process up until now?

Certitudo for example as developers have to do their own participation

But we from the municipality have to think how we get people interested in the whole development process. And what is the best way to do that to get the right input Right input: for example, the square we have 15 people thinking about that what to do. But I think there are people living there that can rather tell us that. They have a lot of experiences we can use, but that is not happening yet. Why? Because it is scary, you are looking for the right moment always to share things so in which moment to show and share with people. Based on what you show people could have very extreme reactions. As a municipality we have so many choices and we didn't yet make up our mind.

Most important learning from DD was that people want to talk, but what are the topics we can talk about. The frame is needed to be given to people...to steer the conversation. And the agenda of the stakeholder (eg, dev) may not match what the people want. Eg, people want park but the dev has paid a lot for the plot so he wants to make something that gives him back the money.

Some event on May 18 is happening where she is trying to ask the developers to be there and use the opportunity to ask the people. To be on speaking terms with the people. I have a lot of conversations with Natasha from DD and other communication colleague.

When I tell them what people are thinking about, then they think I have already decided.

Hence they have diff opinions on what is participation. You can have a talk with citizens about the urban environment how it should look like etc cos it is too abstract it will not be very productive. So something specific is better. But there are citizens that are more interested in having these discussion on abstract topics (these are like some expert kind of citizens who have some specialities?) Make a special group of citizens and have a long term relation with them, meet once a month or so and talk about progress and know what they think of. That might be nice definitely.

Perceived trust between communities and municipality: is not so good.

Why? They have a lot of expertise and ideas about how things should be, because a lot of people do that because they have a lot of passion and they want it to be good. But from the municipality not everything has to be an "A" or a "10". Sometimes its like the priorities are not matching. And sometimes when people do not get what they want, they are disappointed not because it is not good, but because it is not what they wanted. Or that their ideas were not used.

But this area the discussion was more about how do we combine things. In campus and city center this part is more difficult

A lot of these kind of conversations have a lot of history. Openness from citizens and municipality to have a good conversation: sometimes from municipality you are living in your own world and you make a lot of steps, we decided a lot we are fully in the project. We have a year f history and now if we share with you, then it is not matching. It is a lesson for us, to share things in the right time. Just sharing is enough but also to take them along. Citizens having trust in other partners like the developers: everyone knows that what developers want in the end is money. So if the housing is simple and cheap the people don't like it. But if it is something nice with garden etc then it is fine. So there can be always this mismatch. It is their responsibility (talking about the developers) to share their plans with the people. Not of the municipality. As a municipality we have to make a clear judgement, we have to decide if you did the right things and if it fits in our frames. So for certitudo they have to do their own participation process.

Would you monitor this? Yes, when dev is organizing some event with people then people of the municipality are also there to check what is happening what are the main questions etc. The town hall also wants to know if you had a participation evening, what were the main points you talked about. We say this is an obligation but it is not a law. The story is if you don't do it you will have problems with the town hall later so...

When the townhall decides about a project, then that is the frame decided and then you can work within that frame. So as a municipality we can organize what we want to do with that space or the square for example. So these are important participation moments for the municipality. My dream, I really want a caravan or container in the square and we sit there one day a week and people can come there and ask questions. Challenges: we are thinking about it, then we have to make it concrete, what do we want who will sit there, do we need license etc. So the planning of it. Can think of many ways why it doesn't work.
