

























January 7th 1918

My dear Antoine,

I've received your letter from December 6th , ten days ago. I'm still (...) my "wild life". I am always on my way and almost never at the "cantonnement" (temporary living place). I'm doing around 6 hours riding the horse per day, between 6 and 12. In the afternoon, I usually go hunting or fishing. There are some partridges as big as chickens here. I would really enjoy this lifestyle, if i were in France and if there weren't (mannutes?)

My old "lucky/jammy", you're talking about going..

We arrived yesterday, from a 3 days trip, to Thasos island. On our way, we've been attacked by three "Boches" eroplanes, 4 bombs were shot from the "Buffle" but all of them ended on the sea. The weather is always warm here, but we rather be on the sea that on Salonique's port, it is way warmer there. Nothing else to tell you today, my best wishes to father Jean if he's still with you.

My best regards, Alexandre Everyday, he went out by riding his horse from his temporary living place (the military camp). He would go out through the broken city walls, passing by the fountain. He would stay outside of the city walls for hunting or fishing. After finishing the afternoon activities, he would come back and stop at the fountain for a short rest.

He was a French Navy soldier staying in Thessaloniki, and he had been sent to Thasos island. During his stay in Thessaloniki, he also come to the port and enjoy the sun. Before going to Thasos, he involved in the "Water Blessing" ceremony for a safe journey to Thasos. On the voyage, he survived from the German bomber attack and arrived the island safe.


He stayed in an unit in the buildings of the postcard. He enjoyed the sun of Greece very much and always went out to the public plaza and the waterfront for sunbathing.


12 Sep 1917










An Abstract translation of the previous drawings into a model and dismantled them into pieces














Through *The Parade*, new programs are imposed to each of the locations to generate new tensions and interactions to the context.






The context in the project is less about the urban setup but refers to certain object(s) in the site. By imposition of the pavilion, it challenges the context, at the same time, influences the surrounding.







Arch of Galerius is chosen as the site for design development. It is located at the intersection of Egnatia Street and an corridor from Rotunda to the waterfront.





The design is being re-interpreted repeatedly from models to drawings, to re-build and redraw itself to reach to final stage.







