
## George Gershwin

Rhapsody in Blue is a 1924 musical composition by American composer George Gershwin for solo piano and jazz band, which combines elements of classical music with jazz-influenced effects.


The piece received its premiere in the concert, An Experiment in Modern Music, which was held on February 12, 1924, in Aeolian Hall, New York, by Paul Whiteman and his band with Gershwin playing the piano.

The orchestration version of Rhapsody in Blue came later on when Ferde Grofé, Whiteman's pianist and chief arranger, made new orchestrations in 1926 (theater orchestra) and in 1942 (symphony orchestra).


Since the mid-20th century, the 1942 version has usually been performed by classical orchestras playing the expanded arrangement. In this form, it has become a staple of the concert repertoire. It has direct popular appeal while also being regarded respectfully by classical musicians.





















London and The Site








The project sits at a very important junction in London, where it connects the south bank of River Thames to the north, and links the west and the east sides of the city.




The site is located at the center point of a cultural project led by the City of London Corporation, called "Culture Mile".

The new house of music will be one of the major project facilitating this cultural project, which aims at creating a vibrant and exciting cultural atmosphere to this area.























