LAYERING OF TIME

"each intervention adds a new 'layer' of history to the building" (Meurs, 2016, p. 36).
This 'layer' is a concept worth elaborating on since it is used often in architectural literature.
A value that manifests itself, for example, in the patina (the traces of time). (Meurs, 2016, p. 36)
