The literature of Riegl and Rijksdienst voor het Cultureel ERfgoed is about different values related to monuments and ruins. The texts of Healy and Scruton are mainly based on (philosophical) notions on (free and dependent) beauty.

#### Reflection Relevance

Ruins are highly valuable objects within any culture, as they are the remaining evidence and witnesses of local or cultural histories, the threats of disappearance which ruins withstand has therefore to be taken serious and saving them from disappearance is a relevant and important task. Also, it appears that the majority of men dislikes decay in architecture and consider it as unwanted. The research offers different views towards decay, in order to open up the minds of its readers and show the other sides of decay in the built environment and to take away the narrow minded (Western) view of dislike and not-wanting towards decay:
