




Counterpoint




Second Soviet Masterplan for Tbilisi - 1970





Plan of the City of Tbilisi by Jean-Baptiste Bourguignon d'Anville - 1782



Plan of the City of Tbilisi (unknown author) - 1800








Armenian Pantheon of Tbilisi


