




Structural diagram de Leeszaal









Axonometric view Staircase de Leeszaal

POETIC THEMATICS

The above stated characteristics of Maastricht are quite literally translated from the writings and readings of the city. They are the chosen words to translate the identity of the place to the reader and form the structural elements of the literary space.

As a further exploration of the literary space and its characteristics, this research aims to strip the space to its bare core. To understand the meaning of the characteristics and their origin. As the coming readings will show, these four thematics of *nature and man*, *the observer*, *intimacy and time and its traces* became noticeable as reoccurring themes and, in retrospect, are integral in what we call the foundations of modern day poetry and philosophy. Therefore, their genesis is more common, or generic, and not necessarily only to be called characteristic for the poetic description of Maastricht. Still, these poetic thematics provide a more thorough understanding of the act of writing and expressing.




