The Journey

The journey of the Small Sibling has two kinds of bubbles. Big Bubbles appear when Small Siblings has a conversation with Big Siblings. It contains material for the weekly reflections. Small Bubbles are added every time Small Siblings changed one of the negative thoughts regarding their sexuality and their connection with God.

The Conversation

Small Siblings talk with Big Siblings through vocal messages, while Big Siblings respond with videos. Big Siblings reply by sharing a similar experience, thus focusing on empathy. When Big Sibling answer to the vocal message, Big Sibling's bubble will "hug" the other bubble to display affection and support to the Small Sibling.
