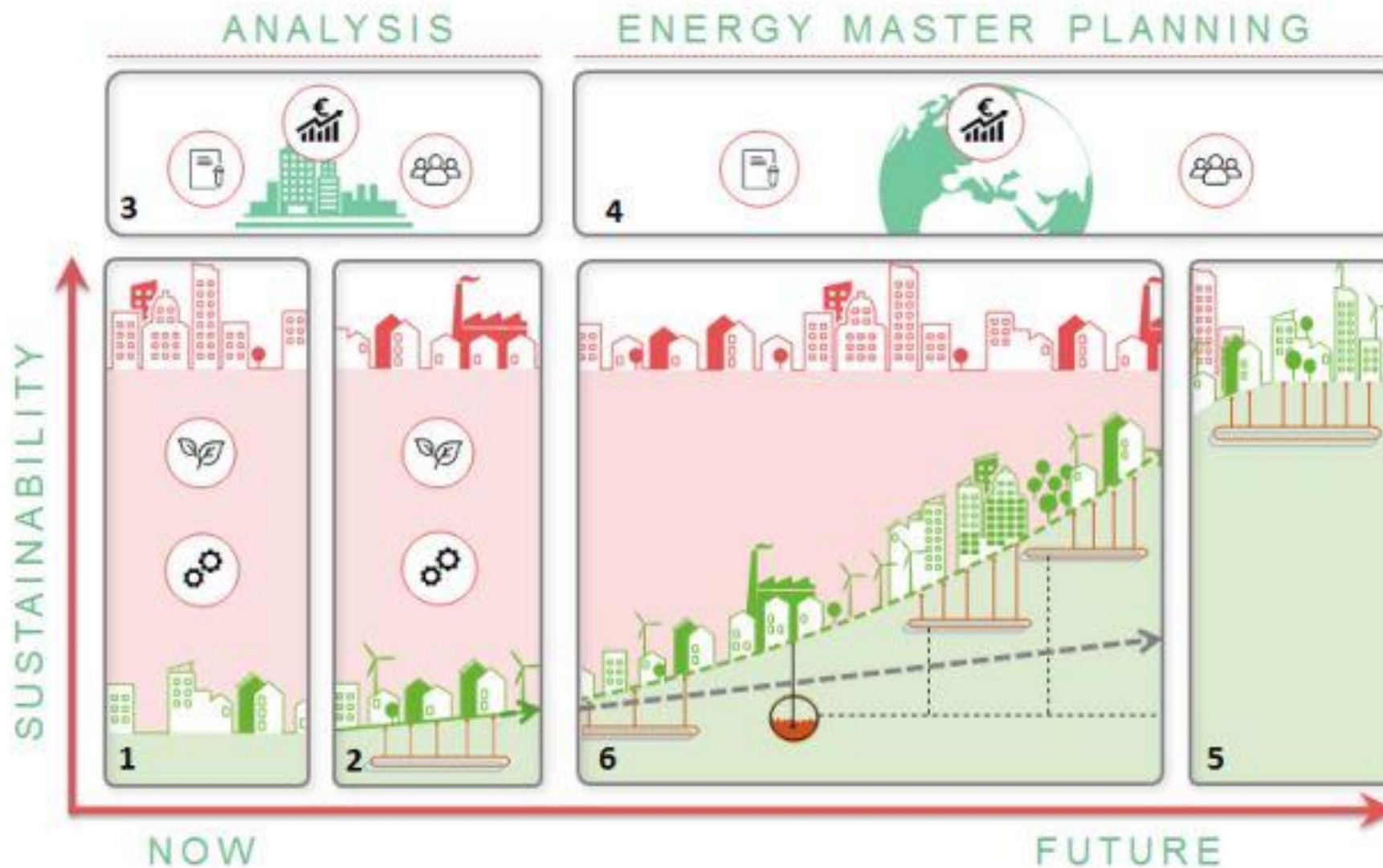
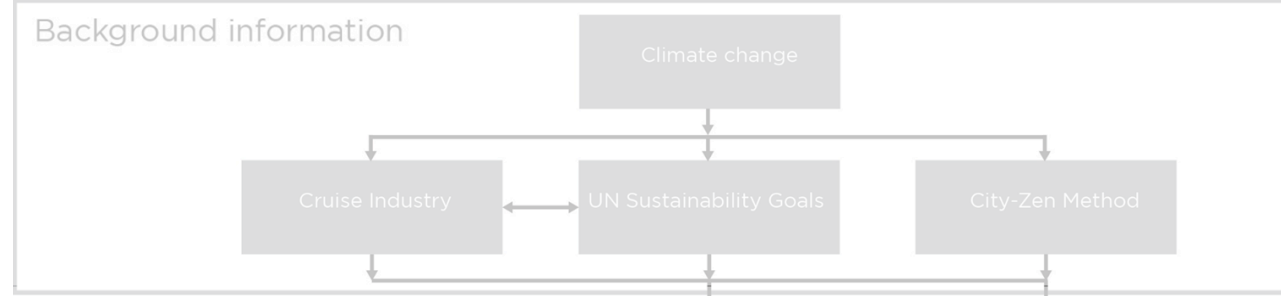


Figure 1: City-zen energy transition methodology.

• Retrofit

- Eliminate single use plastic

- Dispose waste to land where it can be recycled.

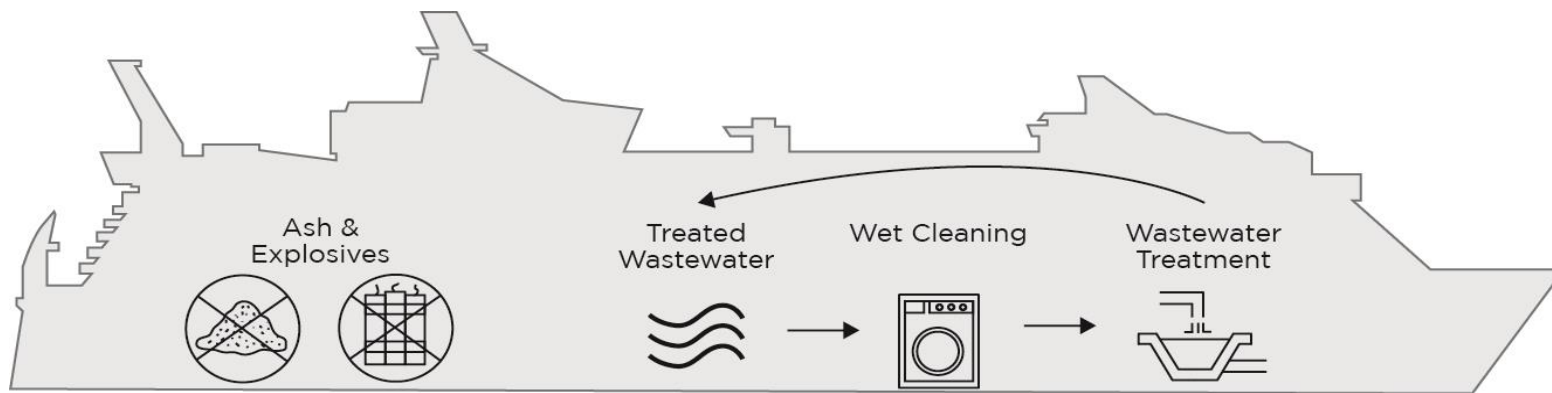

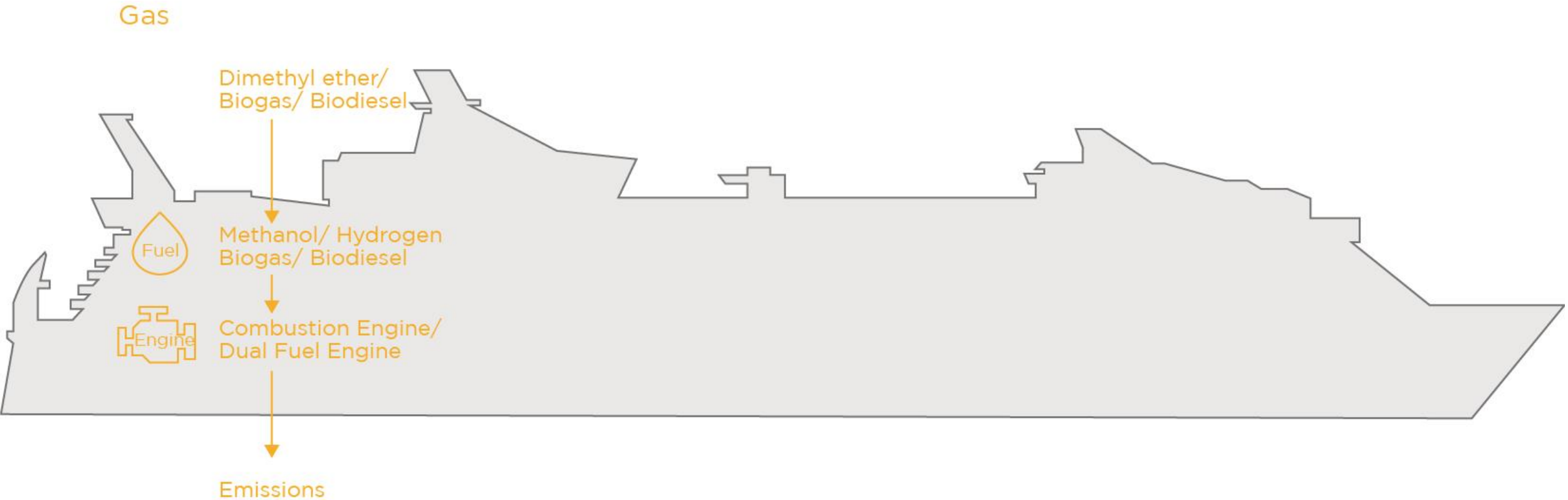
- Replace the paints, lights, and batteries with sustainable alternatives.

- Dispose of paint waste, lights, batteries and photo, and printing waste to land where it can be recycled.



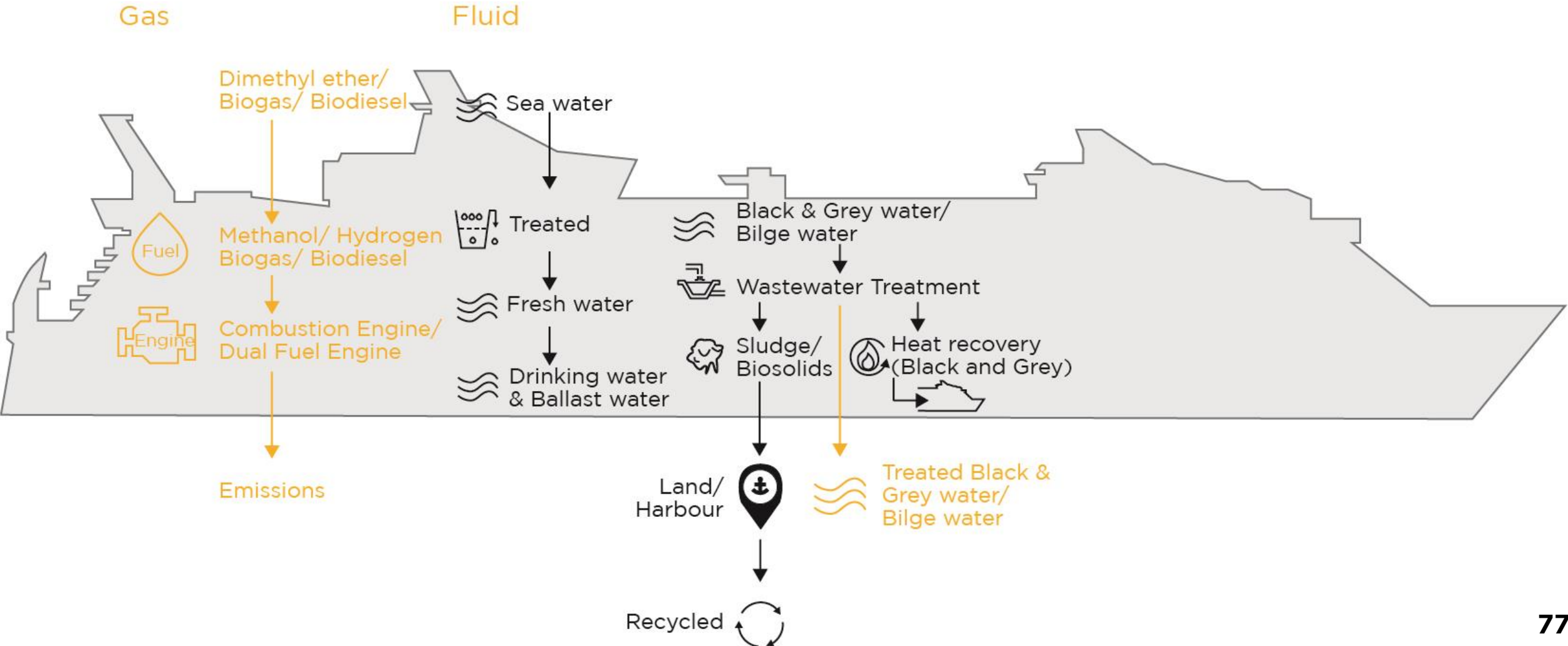
