

INTRODUCTION


My graduation project can briefly and boldly be summarized as "the redefinition of the Havana Profunda identity". My focus will be on daily life and people's typical habits. How can (modern) architecture influence those principles?

Diez de Octubre is an area at the heart of Havana, serving as the residential backend of the revolution-shaped, touristically attractive front-ends of Havana Vieja and Vedado. Personally I look at this neighbourhood as a collage of several districts, all with their own fragmented identities. The Calzada de Diez de Octubre plays a very important role in this as it connects all of them to the greater picture of Diez de Octubre. The street can be seen as the main vain that not only connects these unique districts to each other but also connects the entire area to Vieja and Vedado.

My research is based upon both my own experiences in Havana and the mapping of the area. As there was little information available the research appraach was "map and learn".
