














The Katoenveem used to be well connected with its surrounded industrial complex, as well as other linked cities for cotton transportation.

However, with the decay of cotton industry and gradual demolition of the building complex, the very specifically designed cotton warehouse had become less and less functional.

At present, the Katoenveem building appears to be an aged, introvert building on the end of the pier. It is isolated from its surroundings and the city of Rotterdam/Schiedam. In other words, the Katoenveem is not in its original context and has a serious dislocation of time and place.



GROUP CULTURE VALUE MATRIX




4 scales of culture value will justify the renovation process and clarify how the specific culture value is affected by it.

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HOW TO RECONNECT THE ISOLATED KATOENVEEM WITH ITS SURROUNDINGS AND PRESENT URBAN LIFE?

RESEARCH OUESTION

Katoenveem is not in its original context and has a serious dislocation of time and place, which has resulted in its isolation. Therefore, the design concept is to reconnect the isolated and closed cotton warehouse to its surroundings and present-day urban life.




VIEW FROM SOUTH



CLOSE → OPEN

Opening up the middle part of the north and south façade makes the building not unreadable anymore. The transition between inside and outside is more smooth. This operation has maintained the contour of the building and hence the horizontal characteristic remains.



5 COMPARTMENTS → 3 COMPARTMENTS

With the demolition of 2 compartment walls in the middle, compartments B,C and D merge into one big compartment where more possibilities will happen. While compartment A is chosen as a representative of the compartmentation.










REPETITION → VARIATION

Part of the repetitive facade, mainly on the south and north façade, are to be replaced by transparent curtain wall.

The services of the Katoenveem, including the conveyor system, sprinkler system, and moveable lights stay as vivid evidence of the original functinality.




RECONNECT BY RE-PROGRAM

With limited architectural intervention, the project was successful because of the reprograming.






New grids of steel frames are parallel to the old grids, while do not intervene with the old beams and columns for the vast majority.



Orange: new structure. Grey: old structure




