Sequence of 9 different small scale urban squares and gardens



1 We'd rather NOT take the stairs



a staircase can be so visually inviting though that it beckons one to try it out. (or there simply is no other option)

2 People walking up and down staircases are a spectacle: we like to observe things that move.

4 A long, narrow staircase might look intimidating from both the top and the bottom. If a lot of steps are needed because of a large height difference: better break up the staircase with landings.





5 A staircase is also more inviting if it opens up into the space from which its traffic arrives.




